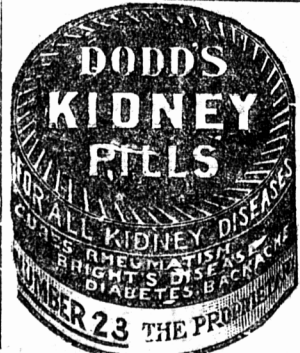

issued by the directors of the Bank. They state that there are now branches of the Bank in 188 schools, located in 26 Canadian towns and cities from St. John, N. B., in the east to Prince Albert, Sask., in the west, including Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto and London, and that the deposits are close to the quarter million mark. The report shows that in the last two years 820 accounts aggregating \$18,814.32 have been transferred to branches of the chartered banks by pupils leaving school, and as the Penny Bank is only in its infancy, this feature is bound to become more marked from year to year. Thus, it will be seen that the Penny Bank is serving a useful purpose as a feeder to the chartered banks of the Dominion.
