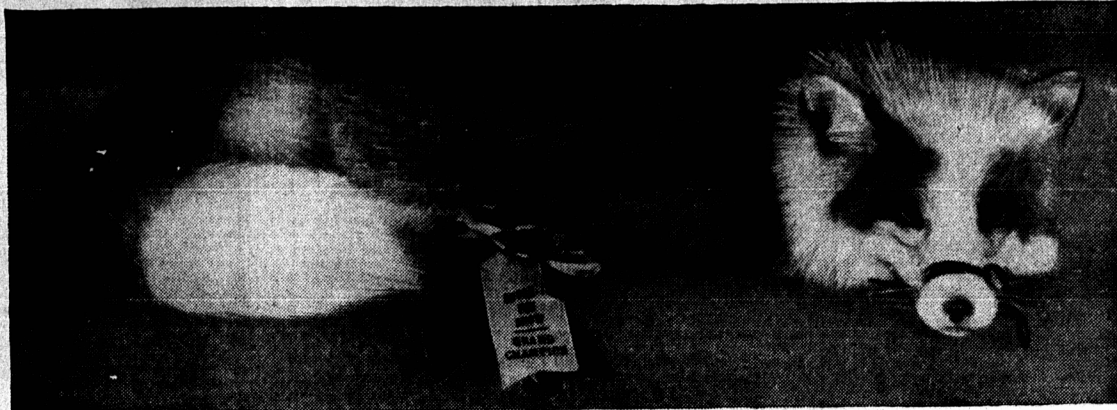

**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**WINNIPEG, June 14 — (CP) —**  
Continuing to display considerable strength, rye futures were 3 5-8 higher, July cent a bushel higher at the close today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. July closed at 81.55 1-8.

**CHICAGO, June 14 (AP) —**  
Rye was firm to strong but most other grain markets eased under short selling and profit cashing today after marking up important gains during early trading.

At the finish wheat was 3-8 higher to 3-8 lower, July \$1.83 3-8. Corn was unchanged to up 3-8. July \$1.18 1-2. Oats were 3-8-3-4 higher, July 67 1-4-3-8. Rye was 1-3 1-8 higher, July 48 3-4-7-8.

**MONTREAL, June 14 — (CP) —**  
Selected leaders among issues with good price-earnings ratings showed strength in transfers today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. Utilities, industrials and banks moved up a notch or two in the indices to new tops but papers, after displaying early firmness, dropped back and with a few exceptions recently improved securities accounted for most decreases.

Strongest spots among individual stocks were Celanese, which jumped 3 1-2 on a small turnover, and Sicks, Common and voting trust in beta. C.P.R. was at its best since 1933 and Winnipeg electric, up 1 3-4, hit a new high in active deals.

**NEW YORK, June 14 — (AP) —**  
Spurred by further investment demand for rails, utilities and assorted specialties, numerous stock market favorites today hit new peaks for the last eight years in one of the liveliest sessions of the past two months.

The principal flaw in the picture was that pivotal steels, motors and many other industrials were hesitant from the start. Selling also developed in some of the recently buoyant aircraft. Gains of fractions to 3 or more points however were well in the majority at the close.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was up 3 of a point 66.4 where it was only 2 under its top since 1927.

**TORONTO, June 14 — (CP) —**  
Base Metal and Western Oil stocks were up slightly at the close today and the gold group recorded a decline of a half-point.

The gold stocks were moderately weak from the opening and there
