What does this mean to you? That your physician by the use of this test will be enabled to decide whether or not an immediate operation is necessary.

Also in the case of some folks who may not think they are ready, it will enable their friends or the family to get them home instead of allowing them to remain too long in hospital, and become, as it is called "hospitalized."

It is certainly a useful test.
