### Hints for the Motorist

#### THE HOOD COVER

DURING COLD WEATHER

There is a general tendency for the cooling system to act too energetically and to keep the engine too cold for economical operation and ready starting and its activity must be reduced to meet the conditions brought about by low air temperatures and the short runs and long stops that characterize winter driving. Since the actual evaporation of the fuel is effected by heat supplied to it after leaving the carburetor—which acts mainly as the fuel and air measuring device, it is vital that the cylinders and exposed intake passages should be kept hot and that the temperature of the underhood air should be high. It is only by permitting the jacket water to heat quickly and by keeping it warm, that excessive gasoline waste and thinning of the engine oil by un-evaporated fuel can be minimized. The most generally applicable device for curbing the over-activity of the cooling system is probably the heavily padded hood cover with adjustable curtain to cover the radiator front, used in connection with a radiator thermometer. It not only can be adjusted to close entirely air movement through the radiator, but it very largely prevents heat losses from both the radiator and the hood metal itself. With one of these properly adjusted, an engine warms up quickly and keeps warm a long time when idle and still can be kept from overheating under severe service. Hoods with louvres or slits in their sides, require the closing of the louvres in severe weather. Bolted-on sheet metal plates are sometimes furnished for this purpose and they should be attached when cold weather begins. Such louvre covers can be made, if they are not furnished as part of the equipment. A radiator fitted with a tightly fitting shutter covering its front and capable of being opened or closed by any degree from the operator's position, is a very practical device, much more convenient than the adjustable hood and curtain, but even when this arrangement is in use—and radiators thus equipped are on the open market—a hood cover still proves of value. With a hood cover or a shutter equipment it is usually unnecessary to disconnect the fan in order to maintain sufficient engine heat.

#### OBSTINATE WOMEN TRIED TEMPER OF MIXED JURY

MONCLAIR, N.J., Dec. 7.—New Jersey's first mixed jury—five women and seven men, including one married couple—which yesterday decided a case in favor of a hardware concern suing to collect a debt, had an exasperating experience trying to reach a decision.

The court remained, 11 to 1, on jury balloting for a long time. The married pair—Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Stone, jr., insisted that they were "perfectly agreed all along." The foreman of the jury said it was one of the women members who was to blame for failure to agree on a verdict at once.

"She just sat there, and said she thought the verdict ought to go to the other side—but wouldn't say why," he said.

Once during the trial the sergeant-at-arms had to warn the jury box occupants against talking.

When it was all over, the jurors said they had enjoyed their service. Each received a fee of 75 cents. The Stone's took theirs separately.

#### CANADIAN DOLLAR IS WORTH IN NEW YORK ONLY 86.25

New York, Dec. 7.—Canadian funds at New York were unsettled and weak today, selling down to 86.25 approaching the low record of 85.50 in February last.

Bankers interested in the flow of funds and credits across the border say that nothing specific has happened to force the unfavorable quotation on Canada, and explain that the movement is both natural and seasonal with Canada making efforts to clean up the usual year-end balances.

It is expected that the rate will not right itself very soon, a though there is the chance that some changes may be affected after the first of the year. It is expected that the government will take steps to lift the unofficial embargo on sales of Canadian securities in the Dominion by foreign owners within a few weeks.
