Overseas Marriages Are Successful, Survey Indicates

OTTAWA, May 21 - (CP) - The Veterans Department reported today that a cross-Canada survey has "indicated that the overwhelming majority of overseas marriages of Canadian servicemen are as successful as even the most optimistic could expect." The survey, conducted by the Department and sponsored by the Government's rehabilitation information committee, found that those they talked to among the more than 45,000 British and European brides had two main gripes: 1. Continuation of the "war" brides' label long after their honeymoons and two years after the war. 2. The "heartbreak ship" type of publicity that springs up occasionally when a dissatisfied wife heads back to Britain or the continent. The Department quoted Mal-Gen. B.W. Browne, C.B., D.S.O., M.C., assistant national commissioner of the Canadian Red Cross Society, as agreeing with their finding that the great majority of the marriages are clicking. The Department reported a "negligible" number of divorces among the 43,695 marriages in Britain and the 2,675 on the continent. In all, those couples have borne 20,812 children. New Brunswick was selected by the department as a typical example of what has happened to the marriages. It welcomed 1,820 overseas wives and in January 1,760 were still living there. Of the others, 38 had moved to other parts of Canada or the United States, one had died and 21 had returned overseas. Of that 21, six went with husbands who planned to settle down over there; one was a widow; another widow had only come over to meet her husband's people; another wife was called home because of her father's death. Only 12 left Canada because they did not like it and only two of those obtained divorces. Red Cross officials reported they had pending about 20 applications for passports for New Brunswick overseas wives. They are based "on a variety of reasons." In all, the Society said there were about 25 "problem cases" among the wives. More than 1,000 of the couples have settled on N.B. farms and the survey found the wives "generally happy."

PHOSPHATE ISLANDS ARE REHABILITATED

GRAHAM (Canadian Press Correspondent) AUCKLAND, N.Z., May 21 - (CP) - Rapid progress is being made in re-equipping the phosphate islands, Nauru and Ocean Island, from damage done during the war. The islands, which have been administered under joint mandate by Britain, Australia and New Zealand since they were taken from Germany after the First World War, are of vital importance to Australia and New Zealand as the main source of fertilizers. The huge cantilever loading equipment at Nauru which enabled a ship standing out to sea to be fully loaded with phosphate in a single day, was wrecked by shellfire from a German warship in 1940. Further damage to the equipment on both islands was done after their capture by the Japanese. Now the islands are being brought back into production. Improved quarrying, processing and loading machinery is being used pending the replacement of the \$3,000,000 worth of machinery ruined by the enemy. It is expected that over 200,000 tons of phosphate will be shipped in the year ending June 30, and that 500,000 tons will be shipped in the next year. The quantity will increase in the two subsequent years as reconstruction proceeds.

"CITIZENSHIP" STAMP ON JULY 1. - Widespread interest will attend the announcement of Postmaster General, the Hon. Ernest Bertrand, K.C., M.P., that on Tuesday, July 1, 1947, the Eightieth Anniversary of Confederation - a special 4-cent stamp will be issued to mark the event of Canadian Citizenship. The new stamp will be about the same size and vertical arrangement as the 10-cent Pictorial of 1942 (approximately 25 mm x 38 mm). Canadian Citizenship will be symbolized in the design by the figure of a youth standing, with upraised hand and arm, on the Northern portion of the Western Hemisphere. The geographical outlines of Canada are broadly indicated at his feet. The colour of the stamp has not yet been decided, but will probably be blue.
