LIFEBOATS AND SEAMEN.

Harold A. Sanderson, a director of the White Star line, giving evidence before the British Titanic enquiry, said if regulations requiring that steamships be manned with able-bodied seamen were adopted, they could not be lived up to for the reason that there would not be sufficient men qualified for the purpose.

Mr. Sanderson, speaking of lifeboats, declared it would be impracticable for a vessel of the Titanic class to carry boats sufficient to accommodate all on board, and that in rough weather it might be impossible to launch boats at all.

WARSHIPS LEAVE FOR HAVANA

WASHINGTON, June 10.—The Navy Department acting under instructions from the State Department last night ordered Admiral Osterhaus to proceed forthwith from Key West to Havana with one despatch ship and one other ship.
