WHEN GOVERNMENTS FALL.

It is seldom that a government once firmly established fails of popular support because of a single act of wrongdoing, although the case of the Macdonald Government in 1873 was very like that.

The Mackenzie Government fell in 1873 not for what it had done wrongly so much as for what it had omitted to do. There were a succession of bad harvests, great commercial depression, many business failures, and the Government failed to realize the growing demand for a protective policy.

That was also an exceptional case. The causes of the downfall of the Conservative Government in 1896 were again different from those of 1873 and 1878. The Government had been too long in power, the party had lost in quick succession from its head Sir John Macdonald, Sir John Abbott and Sir John Thompson, scandals had clustered about some prominent members of the party, there was finally an open revolt in the cabinet against Sir Mackenzie Bowell's leadership, and, last but not least, the party was committed to pass the unpopular remedial bill.

The history of provincial Governments in Canada shows somewhat more frequent changes, brought about by a variety of causes. To the credit of Canadian public life we say that very rarely if ever has a minister of state at any time misappropriated public funds to his own use, except possibly in the way of travelling expenses or as incidentals under some colorable pretext. But sometimes an honest and capable government becomes too lordly for a democratic people, or too indolent in attending to their public duties.

For a multitude of small faults and delinquencies rather than for one great one, some Governments lose the popular regard and support. Despising or neglecting small things, they fall by little and little. Too much allowed in extras or in slighted work to a favorite contractor, condoning too far the misconduct of a party official, making unpopular appointments, suppressing information properly called for in the Legislature, failure to keep promises made in the fervor of an election campaign, the laying on of unpopular taxes and so on, are contributory causes to defeat.

Another cause is found in the changed personnel of a cabinet, a minister retained who has lost his

usefulness, and so on. Moreover in a long term of power a large portion of the electorate is changed by the death or removal of old supporters and young men coming in their places who do not always share the political views of their fathers. Any act done by a Government for party's sake that offends against the spirit of fair play is always a source of weakness. On the other hand charges made maliciously against a Government and not substantiated will injure the Opposition.

We do not think that as a rule the party journals contribute very largely toward keeping a government in power or turning it out. This is not because the press as an institution has not an influence with the public and also an influence for good in many matters. But a wary public has learned that the supporting press seldom or never concedes that the government of the day, or any of its members can be guilty of a fault or has made a mistake, while the Opposition press can rarely find anything praiseworthy in their doings.

The over-zeal of the party press on both sides largely destroys its influence. In Britain where all the leading organs of public opinion are mainly independent of party but closely follow and set forth the drift of public opinion, the influence of the press in elections is much greater than it is in Canada. The people make up their minds, not suddenly, but by slow degrees. And the people are fairly charitable in their judgment. The great jury of the people like the smaller juries of the courts seem opposed to capital punishment except in extreme cases. They usually give the Government of the day the benefit of any reasonable doubt.

It is most regrettable that so large a part of the telegraphic news of the day is made up of crimes and casualties. Yet it is in the great world as in the small community. A murder, a fire, an explosion are the most talked-of things in the localities where they occur. The newspaper cannot ignore what all the people are talking about. History, and even sacred history, tells of battles, sieges, famines, floods, great crimes and tragedies. If such things were wholly omitted the story of the human race could not be told.
