A HEARST CRITICISM.

It is well enough to take note of what even the non-appreciative critics may say and Hearst's New York American, one of whose editorial deliverances appears elsewhere in this issue of The Guardian, is not appreciative of Canadian institutions while apparently a little jealous of Canada's resources and progress. The American admits that Canada "has a great future" but thinks it is hampered "by its adherence to a dying Empire and an obsolete form of government."

"What Canada needs is a modern form of government," the Hearst organ declares. There would be food for thought in these intimations if they were in strict accord with the facts which they seem not to be. The dying Empire of the Hearst imagination happens to have one fourth of the earth's total population and more than half the world's shipping under its flag, with a navy which gives it the undisputed dominance of the sea, even against the two greatest of its envious rivals. And the same Empire happens also to be the greatest political and national establishment yet set up on earth.

The republics now existing are but of yesterday when compared with the ancient and historic grandeur of the British Empire and not one of them rests on any such substantial basis. Such are a few of the salient facts of the case which move intelligent Canadian citizens to laugh at the ignorance and rapid imaginings of subterfuges as the American. It is true that Canada gives her adhesion to the British Empire, and gives it loyally and proudly, because the connection is mutually advantageous, honorable and dignified.

"CAST OUT THE BEAM."

DEAR SIR:—I notice in your paper of this date a letter from or rather extracted from a letter to "Sunshine" from R. McAulay, Pres. of The Sun Life. You have headed this article in large print, "Good word for Edward Island." Might I ask to where you were referring? I notice the writer of the letter mentioned spoke of a place called "Prince Edward Island" where I was born and have lived for the past thirty years and my family a generation before me.

If you meant this place, I might say that I have not heard of any official measure which changed the name of the Province in which I live and I do not see by what right you have to nick-name it "Edward Island." You have no more right to do so than you have to call the King "Ned."

There is one thing in getting a community to agree unanimously to a measure and quite another thing in forcing it down their throats.

REMARKS.

It is quite apparent, however that his indignation is simulated rather than real, for we note that he dates his letter from "Kennington, P. E. Island." Now P. E. Island is not the name of this Province any more than Edward Island is. He also uses the contraction "Aug" for August, "Pres" for President, and so on. Mr. Beer blames us for changing the name of the Province, and yet himself ventures to do the same, adding thereto the offences of alitring by contraction the name of the current month and also the official title of President Macaulay and the name of his company. This suggests the parable of the mote and the beam.

A capital and inspiring address was delivered by Earl Grey before the Canada Club in Halifax the other day. Regrettably we have no Canadian Club in this City but it is still to be hoped that when His Excellency shall visit us shortly an occasion may be found for him to deliver a public address. It would be a real treat to our citizens if he would do so.

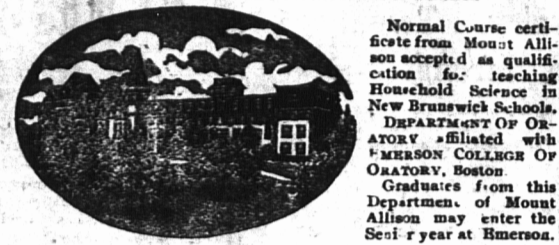
