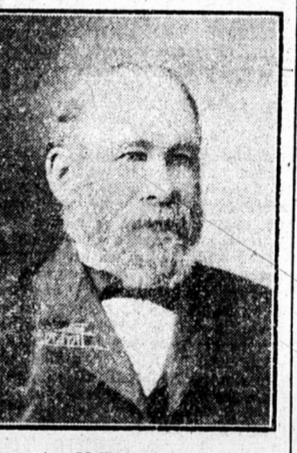

GOVERNMENT DESTROYS 175,000 OF POST CARDS.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1—Through the postoffice department handled an unprecedented amount of holiday mail this year with little contention or confusion, approximately 175,000 postcards bearing Christmas greetings were destroyed today, representing the wasted effort of the senders. Thousands of cards were thrown away because they bore mica or tinzel ornaments and were mailed in unsealed envelopes with penny stamps and with writing on them. In addition to an average of 12,000 pieces of unmailable matter received daily by the dead letter office, about 25,000 unclaimed postcards were confiscated yesterday.

LONDON, ONT. VOTES FOR COMMISSION

LONDON, Ont., Jan. 1—Chas. M. P. Graham was today elected mayor, defeating Ald. Eckert and Ald. Stevenson by large majority. The business men slate of eight endorsed by the board of trade was elected. A plebiscite regarding a commission form of government was overwhelmingly carried.

OTTAWA TIRES OF CIVIC GOVERNMENT

OTTAWA, Jan. 1—All circumstances combined to make today's municipal vote the heaviest ever polled in this city. With the keenest fight for the majority that has occurred for many years, the biggest struggle for the board of control, a fight in every ward for aldermen, and several important questions to be decided on plebiscites and by-laws, the people had great incentive to turn out in throngs to the polling booths. The figures of the vote for mayorally were: Mayor Hopewell, 4,156; E. J. Lavender, 3,937; Ross, 3,340; re-electing the old mayor by a majority of 219.

The vote for controllers was a close fight, as regards the three last of the four elected out of nine candidates: McClenaghan, 6,063; Parent, 4,223; Hinchey, 3,820; Hasteley, 3,548; Wilson, 3,543; Pepper, 3,383; Draper, 3,368; Champagne, 2,861; Stanley, 2,258.

The federal district plebiscite is answering in the affirmative by a low vote of three to one.
