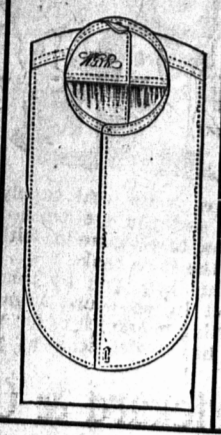

# TUNNEL FINANCES SHOWING THE GAIN

To the Dominion by Constructing this Work as Detailed by George E. Full at the Meeting of Delegates in Market Hall March 10th.

(Continued)

To give this Province and the I. C. R. the full benefit of the Tunnel it would be necessary to build a branch railway from Paines Junction to Port Elgin about 30 miles and also a piece from Cape Traverse to North Wiltshire about 16 miles. This would make the distance by rail from Charlottetown and Summerside to Moncton—(80) eighty miles or by rail, without change of cars, 8 hours ride instead of 6 now.

Montreal in good condition. If they could be hung up in proper cars and shipped direct to destination without change the market price here would be at least one cent per lb. more than the usual price paid in October and November and at least 1 cent more than what is paid in the winter season.
