CROP REPORT

GENERAL

The overall position for the 1946 crop year is generally satisfactory. Wheat in the east, including the Maritime Provinces, yields were only average. In British Columbia fruit has been heavy, and on the Prairies the wheat crop, while not record-breaking, is abundant. The wheat yield in the Prairie Provinces is well above that of last year and also the last ten-year average. The first official estimate is 420,000,000 bushels, as compared with 382,000,000 bushels in 1945 and a 1935-40 average of 345,910,000 bushels. Average per seeded acre yield is estimated at 167 bushels and by provinces is: Alberta 18.9 bushels, as compared with 11.7 last year; Saskatchewan 14.6 bushels, as compared with 11.9; Manitoba 21.9 bushels, as compared with 18.8 bushels. The acreage sown to wheat, at 25,173,000, was larger than a year ago when 22,536,000 acres were planted. The acreage sown to coarse grains and flax at 17,329,000, was down 1,723,000 acres as compared with last year. The estimated production on the Prairies of coarse grains and flax and yield per acre are as follows: wheat, 420,000,000 bushels, yield 16.7 bushels; oats 231,000,000 bushels, yield 30.3 (273,500,000, yield 25.4); barley 149,000,000 bushels, yield 23.8 (144,000,000, yield 21); rye, 6,467,000 bushels, yield 14.1 (4,479,000, yield 10.9); flax 8,540,000 bushels, yield 8.6 (7,338,000, yield 7.1). Sugar beets acreage at 41,800, is up 1,500 acres from last year and production is estimated to be around 200,000 tons, as compared with 445,000 tons in 1945. The honey crop is estimated at 15 per cent below normal. In the Province of Quebec, the season opened about a fortnight later than in a normal year, owing to wet and cool weather. Germination and early growth of all crops were satisfactory under ideal conditions, but insufficient moisture affected development during mid-season. An average crop of hay was stored early in September caused some damage, but weather conditions have since been favourable. Fall wheat production from a substantially reduced acreage was somewhat below normal. Yields of spring grains were well above normality hay was stored. Satisfactory mal. Significance of Soil Structure

(Experimental Farms News)

When reference is made to structure of the soil it means the tendency of the soil to break into its natural aggregates varying in size and shape. This tendency is significant in the utilization and the productivity of soils. The structure of the surface soil affects tilth, or the ease of cultivation and preparation of the seed bed, while the structure of the sub-soil has an important bearing on the drainage and aeration of the soil and on the ease of root penetration.

Soil Survey Investigations, which are conducted by the Field Husbandry Division, Dominion Experimental Farms Service in cooperation with the Provincial Department of Agriculture, have shown that individual soils vary widely in their structure development. Very light sandy soils that are low in organic matter have very little or no structure and the individual sand particles are not bound together. Many well-drained, loamy soils that contain a fair amount of organic matter have a well-developed granular or crumb-like structure in the surface layer. Some clay soils, particularly those low in organic matter, are too plastic for good structure development.

The structure of the surface soils can be modified by the farmer.

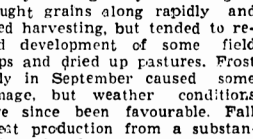
