Strong Demand Continues In Egg Market

A feature of the Maritime egg market at this time is its ability to absorb for consumptive purposes the present production of eggs, Mr. F. M. Nash, supervising Poultry Products Inspector, stated yesterday in the Dominion Department of Agriculture egg and poultry market report. Storage operations to fill the British contract have commenced, Mr. Nash continues, and says he predicts that there will not be sufficient surplus of eggs over domestic or Canadian needs to entirely fill the contract.

The production of eggs on the Island continues steady but there will likely be a decrease in receipts due to the severe snow storm and the resulting blockage of roads. The demand for the product throughout the Maritimes and Newfoundland continues strong and for graded eggs by one cent per dozen. At the time of writing, it is not known if grading station operators have advanced prices to producers, however, with this last advance, producers should be receiving at least 38c per dozen basis Grade A Large.

Generally, grading station operators are now quoting producers for ungraded eggs AL 33, AM 36, AP 28, B 31, C 26. Some dealers at Charlottetown are paying 38c for Grade A Large delivered to their plants. Wholesalers are quoting grading station operators for the graded pack job station AL 43, AM 41, AP 33, B 35, C 26 and quoting retailers for the cartoned graded pack AL 46-7, AM 44-5, B38. Eggs are retailing to consumers in cartons AL 53-4, AM 51-2, B loose 45-7.

Owners of chick hatching operations under Government Approval are required to grade all eggs used for hatching purposes. The eggs are graded for size, quality, cleanliness, shape and texture of shell or all known factors which do influence the percentage hatch and the quality of chicks hatched which go towards the replenishment of farm flocks. Hatching egg suppliers through better feedings and care of eggs can do much to increase the hatchability of the eggs shipped. Last week, eggs hatched all the way from 50% to 85%. The selection and care of hatching eggs is an important factor in the number and quality of chicks hatched, says W. F. Pepper, Poultry Department, O.A.C.

The eggs which are used for hatching should be clean, uniform in shape and color, sound of shell and of good size. Cull out all dirty eggs and those with poor shells, ridges and rough surfaces — also tinted eggs from white shell breeds such as White Leghorns. The size of eggs to be used should be from 23 to 28 ounces per dozen. The proper care of nests and pens will keep eggs clean. Provide a clean, well-bedded nest for every four or five birds. Close the nests at night to prevent birds roosting in them. Clean dropping boards and screened-off pits will help keep eggs clean. Clean any eggs that are slightly soiled with steel wool or a damp cloth. Do not wash them.

The eggs should be gathered frequently — at least three times a day. This helps prevent excess chilling in cold weather and embryonic development in warm weather as fertile eggs start to incubate at 68 degrees. Frequent gathering also reduces breakage. Hatching eggs should be held at 50 to 60 degrees in a room that is not too dry. Ship eggs once a week as best results are obtained from eggs not over seven days old.

Some experiments show a marked increase in the percentage of crippled and spraddled poultis hatched from turkey eggs over one week old when set, compared with eggs only one to seven days old. Careful packing and handling is also important. The eggs should be placed large end up in keyes trays. Rough handling may cause tremulous air cells which lower hatchability.

Hatching eggs cannot be improved after they are produced. The proper care of these eggs, from the time they are laid until they are placed in the incubator, will help retain the qualities necessary for the production of strong, healthy chicks.
