AN AGED SHIPBUILDER.

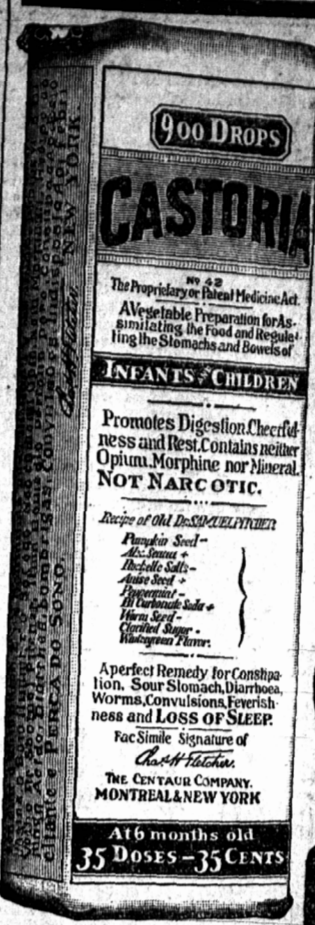

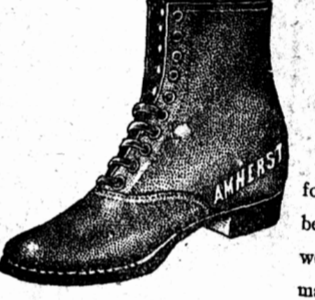

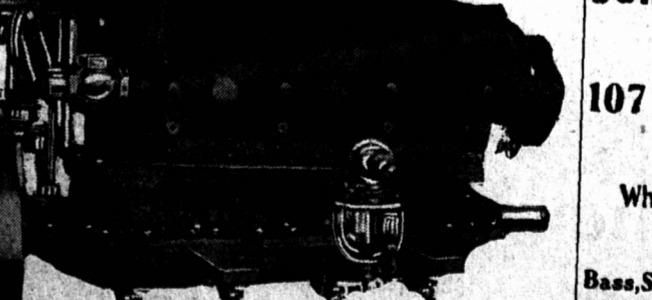
