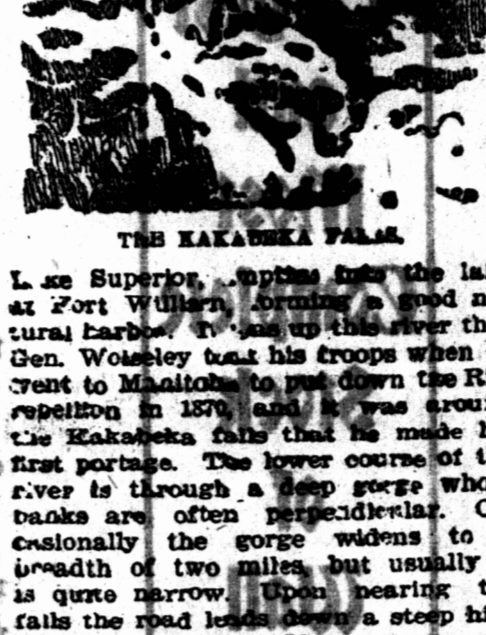
THE EDITORS MAIL.

THE KYKABEKA CHARGE.
A Canadian Waterfall that flows into the Pacific Ocean.
The westbound traveler with his eyes on the Pacific coast is delayed two or three hours at Fort Williams before he reaches his journey's end. Taking advantage of this fact, six of us formed a party to visit Kakabeka falls, a bit of scenery seldom seen by tourists because situated twenty-two miles back from the lake and reached only by wagon road. Though the road is rough and the ride tedious the view of the falls amply repays one for the trip. At least such was the unanimous verdict of our party.
The Kakabeka river, which flows in the broken country north-west of Lake Superior, enters the Grand natural harbor of the city of Thunder Bay. Gen. Wolsey has his troops when at Fort Williams to guard the R. I. rapids. In 1870 there was around the Kakabeka falls that he made his first portage. The lower course of the river is through a deep gorge whose banks are often perpendicular. Occasionally the gorge widens to a breadth of two miles but usually it is quite narrow. Upon reaching the falls the road leads down a steep hillside to a terrace. Here one can see the mist rising above the river and can hear the roar of falling water. Clambering out of the wagon we made our way through the tangled underbrush to the brink of the canyon.
Though the gully had led us something about these falls, none of us was prepared for the sight. What we expected was a series of water broken into a veil of spray and over some cliff; that which we saw was a deep river, 250 feet wide, making a sheer fall ten feet greater than that of Niagara, then whirling away down a black gorge whose banks are so incised that the bottom of the gorge is actually wider than the top. The spectator stands within two feet of the edge of the canyon, and within twenty feet of the brink of the falls. Only as the whirlpool drives the mist to one side can the top of the falls be seen. When one catches the view, that of a rushing, boiling, churning mass of water, the mist rising above the falls, a hundred feet, and within the veil the sun shines a bright blue of promise. From the precipice a ledge of rock so projects that it divides the falling water, the lower part being on the further side. Twenty-five rods below the falls a low timbered island is situated in the middle of the river. One misses the foaming rapids which usually stand guard above and below a cataract. So free is this place of rapids that nothing but the ascending mist and the roar of falling water would give a passenger above the falls any warning of impending danger. While below the falls one might approach with a light boat, to within twenty rods of the foot of the falls. The gorge is narrow, winding, and wilder and more picturesque than that at the whirlpool rapids in the Niagara. Here only that the water which comes through it is more quiet. It is cut by black trap rock and is dark and gloomy.
Such are the Kakabeka falls, situated the Kakabeka falls. The bank of the river has not been laid upon these. The setting of the scene is the forest primeval.
