HUERTA TO BE CANDIDATE FOR MEXICAN PRESIDENCY.

MEXICO CITY, August 14.—A statement made by Minister of War Blanquet that he will not be a candidate for the presidency, and that his only candidate is Provisional President Huerta, has aroused considerable interest here. The close relations between Blanquet and Huerta are considered to make Blanquet's statement tantamount to an official indication that Huerta will run for the office of chief executive of the republic.

CADETS' SHOOTING TROPHY.—At a meeting of the local committee of the Strathcona Trust Fund yesterday, it was decided to purchase a trophy from the funds at the disposal of the committee and present it for annual competition in rifle shooting among the various cadet forces of the Island when in camp each year, commencing with the present camp. The members of the committee are Lieut.-Col. Davison, Dr. Jas. Warburton, Lieut.-Col. Dr. H. D. Johnson (Hon'y Sec'y), Major Weeks, Mr. R. H. Campbell (Superintendent of Education), Dr. Robertson (Principal of the Prince of Wales College) and Mr. C. G. Duffy. At the meeting yesterday, Col. Warburton presided. The trophy will be competed for by riflemen from the various corps of cadets that are encamped, and is to be held for one year by the school to which the winning team belongs. The first match for the trophy which is to be known as the Strathcona Trust Trophy for Prince Edward Island, will take place before the present camp of the cadets is disbanded. The order for the trophy has been placed immediately and it is expected to be in Charlottetown in the next few days. The trophy will take the form of a golden oak shield with a silver grey centre of suitable design.
