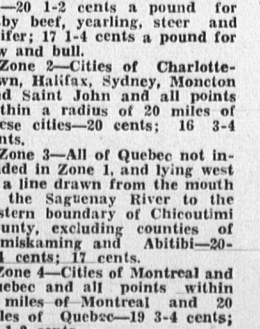
Island Airman Is Injured In Crash
