VICTORY IS COSTLY TO ITALIANS

Colonel Belli and Three Of Staff Killed In Capture Of Azbi.

(By Guardian's Special Wire) WITH THE ITALIAN ARMS AT MAKALE, Nov. 15—(C. P. Havas)—Italian troops captured Azbi yesterday, but it was costly the Fascist high command admitted tonight.

Overshadowing all other news of the engagement 30 miles northeast of Makale was the information that Colonel Belli had been killed. Fascist authorities revealed three other white officers, as yet unnamed, and 20 Askaris had been slain and 50 Askaris wounded.

Jrges Nickel Parking Plan For N. B. City

SAINT JOHN, N. B., Nov. 15—Saint John motorists are wondering if they'll have to pay a nickel every time they park in certain areas. Edward D. Walsh, commissioner of public safety, wants to give "park-o-meters" a trial.

As operated in various United States cities the system solves the problem of parking spaces. Insertion of a coin raises a signal and holds it in position for the period set by ordinance. When the signal is down beside a car the parker either has overstayed the time limit or tried to cheat the city out of a nickel. In either case he gets a \$1 ticket.

"I've been studying this for some time and I am convinced that this device will work out satisfactorily in Saint John," said Commissioner Walsh. "We have a serious parking problem here and something of the kind is needed."

The meters pay for themselves in four months, according to a Kansas City newspaper, which added:

"You can't laugh away the nickel-in-the-slot curb parking meters, militantly atop metal standards on the main shopping streets here since mid-summer. The curb meter seems to be one of those things born to spread over North America. It is a modest, unobtrusive, and chain letters but with something of the same sort of ultimate coverage."

IN MEMORIAM

MR. JOHN McAVINN

The community of Kelly's Cross was saddened and shocked to hear of the sudden death of John McAvinn, which occurred in the Truro Hospital, Truro, Nova Scotia, on September 25, 1935. John, who was in his 29th year, went to Truro April 29, 1935, to seek employment. He obtained a position with Mr. S. S. Purdy, Milk Dealer, where he worked until a week previous to his death, when he stepped on a rusty nail. The wound did not seem to be serious at first, but after a short time it developed into lockjaw, causing almost instantaneous death. The last rites of the Roman Catholic Church were administered by Rev. Anthony Francis of Truro. His remains were forwarded to Kelly's Cross, P. E. Island for burial, where a Requiem Mass was sung and burial services conducted by Rev. J. C. Pitre, P.P., on September 27th.

It is with a feeling of sadness that we chronicle this tragic and premature death. But "in the midst of joy there is sorrow; in the midst of life there is death." Thus when the grim reaper—Death—appears he takes his toll from the ranks of

British Election Highlights

Arthur Henderson, son of the late president of the Disarmament Conference, squeezed through to capture from the Conservatives the Kingswinford division of Staffordshire for Labor by 16 votes. The younger Henderson is standing legal counsel to the Labor party.

Ralph Hall Caine, elder son of the late Sir Hall Caine, the Manx novelist, was one of the few Conservative candidates to increase his majority. He pushed it up from 1910 in 1931 to 12,171 yesterday. He is a director of paper companies in England, Canada and the United States.

The constituency of Epping in Essex sent back Rt. Hon. Winston Churchill, who supported the Baldwin policies while taking an independent line on India, with a majority of 20,000, slightly more than in the last election.

Sir Thomas Inskip, Solicitor-General in the National Government, was returned in a fight against a Laborite in the Fareham division of Hampshire. In 1931 he won a by-election in Fareham and in the general election he was unopposed. This time he gained a 21,000 majority.

James Maxton, leader of Independent Labor Party, doubled his 1931 majority, winning in the Brigetown division of Glasgow by 8,740 votes. Mr. Maxton is an orator of the old school who left the Labor party two years ago because he considered it too Conservative.

J. McGovern, Independent Labor Party member, noted for his attacks in parliament on royalty, was re-elected in the Shetland division of Glasgow by 4,575, where he obtained a margin of only 700 in 1931. Mr. McGovern has on occasion been forcibly removed from the House for his conferring comment.

Thomas Kennedy, former chief whip of the Labor party, returns to the House of Commons from Kirkcaldy, which he recaptured from the Conservatives by a majority of 4,371. He was a junior lord of the treasury in 1924.

Rev. James Barr, long a prominent figure in Scottish Labor circles captured the Coatbridge division of Lanark from the government, with a majority of 4,414 over T. D. King Murray, National Unionist. He is a former moderator of the United Free Church of Scotland.
