ANNUAL SEED FAIR 1906

TO BE HELD IN THE FARMERS' PAVILION, EXHIBITION GROUNDS, Charlottetown, Monday and Tuesday 15th and 16th Jan. '06

F. W. Broderick, Maritime representative, and L. H. Newman, Secretary-Treasurer of the Canadian Seed Growers Association, and Mr. Wm. Rennie, Toronto, Ontario, will have charge of the work.

The program will consist of practice in grain judging, weed seed identification, and practical lectures on practical subjects.

All exhibits must be in place in the pavilion by one o'clock p. m. on Monday, 15th January. No seed shall be admitted for competition for prizes unless the quantities of seed for sale by each exhibitor are at least five bushels of wheat, ten bushels of oats or barley, five bushels of peas, five bags of potatoes, or three of timothy seed.

An increased amount has been granted for prizes. List of products for which prizes are offered can be seen on application to the Secretary of any Farmer's Institute.

All entries must be made with C. R. Smallwood, Secretary of Exhibition, Charlottetown.

TITLED NEWSPAPER OWNER GUSHES OVER CANADIAN FRUIT

OTTAWA, Jan. 3.—A box of the fruit which took the first prize in the collections of winter fruit at the Ontario Horticultural Exhibition held in Toronto last month was shipped to Lord Glenesk, proprietor of the Morning Post, London, Eng. A. McNeil, as President of the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association, received the following acknowledgment of the fruit from Lord Glenesk: "Did such fruit ever grow out of the Garden of Eden! Surely mortals and

angels might well be excited for yielding to such bolts. Canada needs little other inducement to immigration. I must thank you over and over again for this proof that Canada, which can supply all that is necessary, can also supply all that is beautiful. THE PRINCESS LOUISE GETS A BIG ALIMONY

PARIS, Jan. 3.—The conditions of the settlement of the long drawn out quarrel between Princess Louise of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, eldest daughter of King Leopold of Belgium, and her husband, Prince Philippe of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, are as follows: The Prince pays her as alimony \$211,000 annually and also the sum of \$1,000,000 by instalments, while King Leopold

guarantees his daughter an annuity of \$10,000. The Princess undertakes to hand over to the Prince's lawyer all the documents and photographs intended to be used as evidence, divulgence of which will annul the arrangement. The two parties agree to accept a decision of the Court of Gotha granting them a divorce on the ground of incompatibility of temper, and on that ground alone.

BURSTING WATER MAIN STARTLES BUSY LONDON

LONDON, Jan. 3.—Boxing day saw a recurrence of the strange and unusual scene of six months ago, which again at the busiest time of the day disorganized the traffic and caused the crowd to scatter in all directions. It was the bursting of a huge water main of the Hydraulic Power Company in what may be termed the centre of Theatre Land.

People were just crowding to the matinees, when suddenly with a roar, the wooden roadway at the junction of St. Martin's Lane and Cranbourn Street rose and a stream of water shot 150 feet into the air, drenching everyone in the street. No one realized for a moment or two what had happened, but ran madly for shelter. The main burst was followed by subsidiary ones in St. Martin's Lane and Cranbourn Street, in both of which thoroughfares unheated fountains began playing and the gullies were quite inadequate to take off the water which flowed down hill across Trafalgar Square, and blocks of wood pavement were thrown into the air by the force of the water and were playfully dangled upon the point of the jet after the manner of corks upon toy fountains. Several streets resembled rivers and after the burst was checked were closed against traffic for some hours.

YERKES' WIFE WAS WITH HIM AT DEATH

New York, Jan. 2.—Chas. T. Yerkes, the noted railway financier of Chicago and London, died Friday in his apartments at the Waldorf Astoria hotel, where he had been ill for more than six weeks. Mr. Yerkes suffered from a complication of diseases, growing out of a severe cold which he contracted in London early in the fall. His condition had been critical for ten days past and since last night the patient had been kept alive by strong stimulants. Despite the statements, said to come earlier in the day from Mrs. Charles T. Yerkes, wife of the capitalist, that she would not go to the Waldorf Astoria, the following official

statement was made by Dr. Loggins, who had attended Mr. Yerkes throughout his illness. "At the death bed were Mrs. Charles T. Yerkes, his wife; Charles Edward Yerkes, a son, and his wife, Mrs. Charles Robdammiller, a daughter, and myself." At one o'clock Mrs. Yerkes was telephoned to that her husband was dying, and she related and went to the hotel and was present when he died. This was the first time Mrs. Yerkes had been at the hotel during her husband's illness. The death was peaceful, but unexpected at the time.

GLENFINNAN.

Jan. 3.—The school which is under the capable management of Miss Annie McSain, closed for the Christmas holidays, has re-opened but the attendance is small.

Michael Currie who has been the guest of his brother John Currie, during the fall, has removed his family and household effects to a farm on St. Peter's road where he is now residing.

The sportsmen had luck this fall owing to the scarcity of game, excepting wild geese which were plentiful enough, but always kept out of range of the fowling piece.

The oyster fishermen report oysters very scarce this fall. A few years ago big money was made at the business, but owing in a great measure to the non-enforcement of the law during the winter season, the oysters in those rivers are nearly dashed out.

Of late years quite an interest has been taken by the farmers and farmers' wives in the raising and fattening of poultry, for which good prices have been obtained at the market.

ORGANIZED AT CLIFTON.

Rev. A. D. McDonald G. W. P. addressed a large public temperance meeting in Clifton Hall on Wednesday evening 27th inst. Jas. A. Campbell Esq. was called to the chair and suitably introduced the speaker of the evening. Mr. McDonald in a forcible and lengthy address reviewed the temperance situation referring to the great forward movement for bar-room abolition now sweeping over the Province of Ontario, the advanced steps now being taken in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick in the direction of prohibitory legislation and to the noble stand taken by little P. E. I. in relation to the accursed drink trade. He made a short appeal in favor of total abstinence, urging upon Christian men and women the duty of standing together on the side of temperance and righteousness and of working for the complete overthrow of the liquor traffic throughout our land. At the close, a Division of the Sons of Temperance was organized with a charter membership of about forty, and the following efficient staff of officers:—W. P.—Gavin Harding; W. A.—Mrs. J. Lockhart; R. S.—Chas. McGregor; A. R. S.—George Green; F. S.—John Lockhart; Treas.—Arch. Campbell; Chap.—Rev. John Murray; Con.—Harold Found; A. G.—Miss Lena Murray; I. S.—John W. McLeod; O. S.—John G. McKay; P. W. E.—George McKinnon; D. G. W. P.—Harold Found. With the assistance of Grand Conductor, Miss Laura Wedlock of Alexandra Division, Stanley, the above officers were duly installed by the G. W. P. The new society which will meet on Monday of every week enters upon its career with bright prospects of success. With plenty of good material, a wide field for operation and the possession of very considerable talent it is assured that Clifton Division No. 233 is bound to prosper and become a strong moral and uplifting force in the Community.

TUNNEL SCHEME.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 2.—The activity of American capitalists here is further evidenced by the revival of the project of a railway tunnel between Siberia and Alaska, under Behring Strait. An official investigation into the scheme is being held, and the newspapers are discussing it at length. The cost as it is estimated, would be \$250,000,000.
