THE WINTER STEAMER SERVICE OF 1910.

It has not yet been the lot of The Guardian to record a more satisfactory winter steamer service than that which is just now closing. Three things mainly contributed to this result, the fine new winter steamer Earl Grey, the extraordinary mildness of the winter and the more sympathetic attitude of the Government toward this Province and its interests than had hitherto been manifested.

The Guardian has given expression to many complaints with regard to the winter steamer service in some past years. It is a great pleasure to be able to state that the service of the past winter has shown a decided improvement, and that with the exception of a few stormy or foggy days a fairly regular service has been maintained for mails, passengers and freight.

The real test is yet to come, however, when again we shall be called to encounter conditions of storm, cold and ice and such as prevailed in 1905 and other years. As to how such conditions will be met we can only hope for the best and await the result.

TO RESTRAIN THE VETO POWER OF THE PEERS.

Here is in brief how Mr. Asquith proposes to deal with the so-called veto power of the Lords: He has prepared three resolutions for adoption by the Commons. The first of these declares it expedient to disable the Lords from rejecting or amending money bills, including the imposition or repeal of taxes, the vote of supply, the control of public money, or the raising or payment of loans.

any bill which has passed the Commons in three successive sessions and has been two years before Parliament shall become law with the sanction of the King despite its rejection by the Lords. And the third resolution reduces the duration of Parliament from seven to five years.

The second resolution aims to restrict the power of the Lords so that

The Opposition has put forward an amendment which declares that these proposals "would, in effect establish a new constitution based on the absolute supremacy in legislation of a single Chamber." It was expected that the question would be voted upon yesterday.

CONCESSIONS MADE TO THE CONSUMER.

Shouts of triumph from the Liberal press and of "surrender" from the Conservative press have greeted Mr. Fielding's tariff agreement with

the Washington authorities. The great body of consumers care little for the words in which the agreement is characterized by one party or the other. What the consumers see is that a tariff war, which would have increased the cost of living, has been avoided, and a reduced rate of duties on a considerable number of articles brought in, which should in some measure reduce the cost of living.

having those millions in their own pockets. We shall still, despite the reductions, be paying quite enough in customs taxes. Concessions to the consumer are something new and good. Let us hope that more of the same sort may follow.

The Dominion revenue for the fiscal year, which ended March 31, made a new record and passed the hundred million dollar mark.

Mr. Monk, sometime the leader of the Quebec Conservatives, is now in open revolt against Mr. Borden, the Dominion Conservative leader, and wants him removed. This is because Mr. Borden favors a vigorous naval policy. Mr. Monk is by no means a great man, still less is he a great leader, but he is big enough to seriously divide what remains of the Conservative party in Quebec, and by so doing to render Sir Wilfrid Laurier's control of affairs still more secure.

It may be doubted whether the re-valuation of lands for taxation will yield \$20,000 new revenue, as Premier Hazard anticipates, but if it does so Provincial finances should be hereafter comparatively easy. The farmer whose land has been valued at what it is worth will be pleased that the other fellows have to pay as well as he, but those who have sheltered themselves for years behind undervaluation are just the sort of men who will kick vigorously against the re-adjustment.
