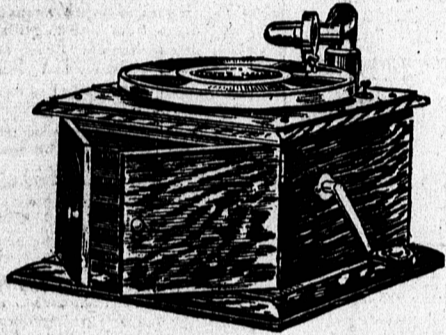

### LONDON STREET BOY HERO OF THE TRENCHES

This is the simple story of one of the brave boys of the Royal Berkshire Regiment whose gallant part in the defence of Ypres has been described in The Daily Mail. He was once a boy of the London streets. His father was a brave man who lost his life in an attempt to save a comrade from drowning. He left behind him the little boy, and a mother weak in health and unable to work. A good Samaritan found the lad, who was nine years of age, and sent him to a "home for waifs and strays."

The boy decided to "be a soldier." His chance came in the trenches around Ypres a month ago, and he took it. He had been given the temporary rank of corporal. His section of the trench was subjected to a terrible bombardment and before long the officers and non-commissioned officers were either killed or wounded. The temporary corporal suddenly found himself in command. "We will stick it, boys," he cried, and there came a ringing answer of approval. So they hung on until a shell from "Jack Johnson" burst and killed or wounded all who were left in the trench. But their work had been done for a few minutes later reinforcements came up.  
For his gallantry the corporal has been raised to the rank of sergeant.

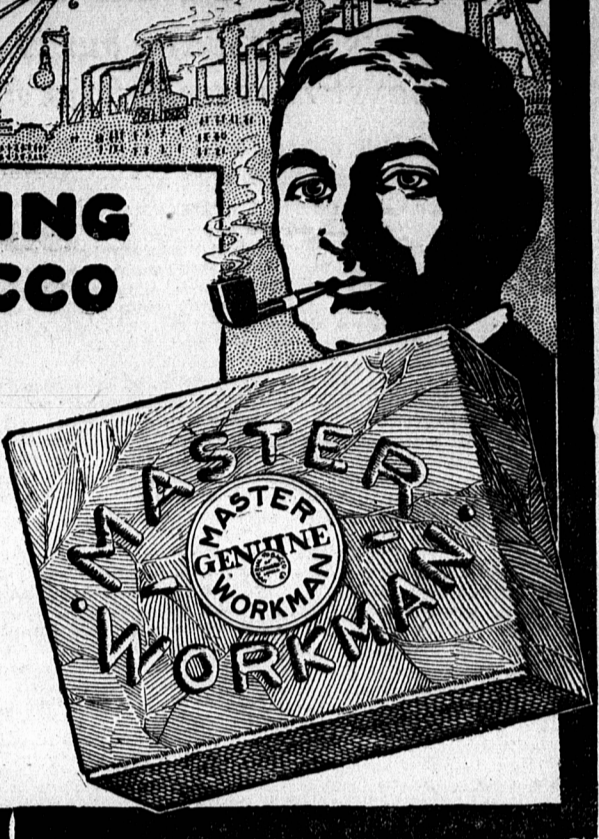
