Selected Issues Edge Upward On Montreal Exchange

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, April 10—(CP)—Selected issued edged upward in moderately active dealings on the stock exchange and curb market today. Many stocks were unchanged and fractional losses were well distributed. Industrial volume expanded while mining interest dwindled.

Among more active stocks, Montreal Power advanced 3-8 on the cash sales and 5-8 on the certificates of deposit following the report that majority of shareholders had accepted Quebec-Hydro's offer of \$25 a share. Butterfly climbed 1-4 as a result of a favorable dividend declaration. Dominion Oilcloth added 1-2 and Southmount, a Montreal Power subsidiary, was up seven cents. Cub dropped 1-8 at 2 3-8.

Other issues fairly active were Abttdl Pfd, International and Consolidated Papers and Shawinigan, all 1-2 better. Bank of Montreal up 1-4 and Famous Players up 1-8. Smelters gained 1-4 points in reaction to release of a highly satisfactory annual statement.

Seagrams, Imperial Oil, Wilsis, Vickers and C. W. Lumber were unchanged while Brazilian slipped 7-8. McColl 1-2 and Brown and Canadian Breweries 1-8 each.

Trading box score: Total sales, 128,300 shares; Industrials, 74,000; mines, 54,200; stocks higher, 2; lower, 39; unchanged, 81; new highs 6; new lows 11.

Slight Recovery Trend At New York

New York Exchange

NEW YORK, April 10—(AP)—For the first time in seven sessions the overall stock market average edged upward today although losers were plentiful and dealings sluggish.

Prices were best in the forenoon. While a few "thin" issues added 1 to 3 points on margin sales advanced 3 to 5 points in fractions. The ticker tape looted after midday and gains were reduced or converted into minus signs at the close.

Distillers Seagram, with a gain of 3-8 in early trading, led Canadian issues at the close. Dome Mines added to early increases and closed up 1-4. Losing early gains, Canadian Pacific closed unchanged. On the curb, Giant Yellowknife eased 1-8.

U. S. lines touched a 1947 peak in further response to a pleasing dividend but eventually retreated and ended up 1-8 at 21 5-8. Allied Chemical was ahead 3 1-4 at 171 1-4 and improvement of around a point or so was related by Pullman at 184 1-4 and Norfolk and Western at 238.

Lesser gainers included Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, General Motors, U. S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, International Harvester, Douglas Aircraft, United Air Lines, United Aircraft, American Telephone, Western Union, "A", International Nickel, American Tobacco "B", American Woolen, Schenley, American Stove (on a raised quarterly), Santa Fe, Pennsylvania Railroad, Great Northern Railway and Chesapeake and Ohio.

Pacific Western Oil, a recent strong spot, dropped 1-8 at 39 3-4 following reports a merger of this company with Mission Corp. was under discussion. Others with smaller recessions were U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Goodyear, Goodrich, Sears Roebuck, Boeing, Anaconda, Kennecott, N. Y. Central, Southern Pacific, Southern Railway and Texas Co.
