Stocks Follow Uneven Trend In New York

(By Frederick Gardner) (Associated Press Financial Writer)
 NEW YORK, Aug. 10 — Buyers and sellers both played a wily game in the stock market today, driving a wily, uncertain trail in the price fluctuations. The weight of the changes was on the side of lower prices in the trading favorites but in the rank and file stocks went individual ways, lacking inspiring leadership for a decisive swing. The Associated Press composite price of 60 stocks was down 4 of a point at 49.4. Transactions totaled 809,880 shares against 829,750 yesterday. Farm implement and mail order stocks took some buffeting in early trading on belated recognition of the fall in farm prices this month might call for revision of hopes of autumn trade in rural areas. Weekly electric power output recorded another fair gain without lifting utility shares out of their rut. Steel stocks sagged. Canadian issues were generally steady. Massey-Harris, Lake Shore, Dime and Ford showed improvement ranging from 1-4 to 7-8 of a point. Distillers and Marconi each lost a fraction as international Nickel sank 1-2 points to 43 1/2. American Sugar broke nearly 1/2 to 23 1/2 following omission of the dividend on the common stock.

TORONTO, Aug. 10 —(CP)—The London flurry in bar golds, resulting from a new run of hoarding, awakened interest in the gold holdings of the Toronto Exchange again today and some of the favorites were pared up in fairly active trading. The index for the group held a gain of 24 at the close. Other indices finished down. Dome was pushed to a new high for the year at 34 1-2 when it closed with a net gain of a point. Lake Shore posted a half point gain. Wright-Hargreaves advanced 1/8 but the close was unchanged at 7.95. Gains of a few cents were held by Beattie, Canadian Malartic, Jellicoe, Leitch, Pamout, Pickle Crow and Sylvanite. Preston traded 48,000 shares. The stock was unchanged at 70. Eldorado developed into a market feature, evidently on the news that the underwriting agreement on treasury shares had been renewed at the prices much above the current market. Trade in the issue was 39,500 shares and the price firmed 15 cents. Industrial harbored some firm spots. Steels, papers and banks posted more gains than losses and the utilities and foods held up well. Page-Hervey went to a new high for the year at 98 and closed at 96 1-8 holding a net gain of 5-8.

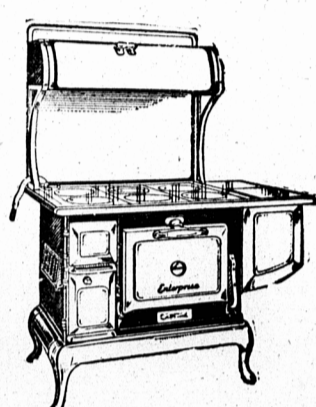

WINNIPEG, Aug. 10 —(CP)—A good export business and firmer prices at Chicago and Liverpool combined to influence firmness on the Winnipeg market today. Wheat prices ruled steady throughout the session at fractionally higher levels. Final quotations were 5-8 higher with October 71 7-8-1-2 and May 74 5-8-3-4 cents. Export trade was highest in weeks, estimated at nearly 500,000. Pit trading was quiet and offerings light today but prices maintained early gains. Chicago moved fractionally higher and with Liverpool's firmness steadied the Winnipeg market. Cash wheat showed only a fair business but spreads on top northern grades improved about a cent. Offerings were light—durums moved moderately but prices were mostly unchanged. Pit trading in coarse grains was again quiet with a light hedging pressure showing on oats and barley.
