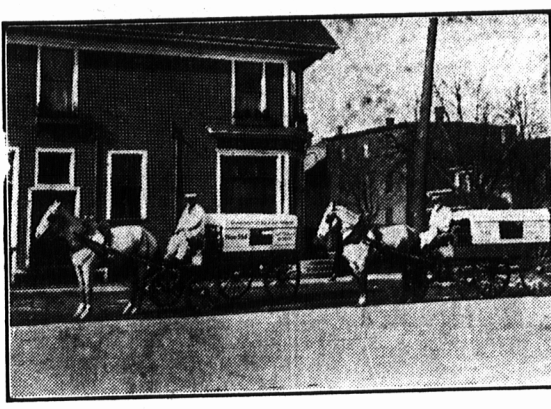

#### Much Business Is Controlled By Yellow Men

(By Charles Nichols) (Canadian Press Staff Writer) VANCOUVER, May 5.—Orientals are cutting an increasingly large slice of British Columbia's business life. The white citizen becomes daily in contact with the Japanese and Chinese in business, not only in a neighborhood shopping district, but in stores operated by Orientals. More than 1,000 retail licenses are held by Orientals in Vancouver alone. About 146 of them are fruit and vegetable stores serving as retail outlets for those farming industries into which the Chinese and Japanese have made deep inroads. There are just 181 stores of this type, including chain stores, operated by whites. Participation of Orientals in farming the rich Fraser River valley and its delta has antagonized white farmers who claim lower standards of living enable the Orientals to operate successfully on plots so small that prices for produce are depressed. Illustrative of the part played by the yellow races in the province's agriculture are figures which show that Orientals farm 50 per cent of the berry acreage and 2,700,000 of the greenhouses in square feet of the province compared with 2,200,000 square feet owned by white farmers. Japanese entered the farming industry when their operations in the fishing and lumbering industries were restricted but Chinese, coming in the largest part of the original farming group, have been in it from the start. The Japanese are becoming a factor in poultry and berry farming. Of more than 8,500 farming acres in the lower mainland, 2,200 are operated by Orientals. Chinese and Japanese produce is distributed through their own wholesalers. There were 23 of these in the lower mainland operating in the year compared with 50 oper-

#### British Test For Motoring Irks Visitor

(By I. NORMAN SMITH) (Canadian Press Staff Writer) LONDON, May 5.—(CP)—The Canadian visiting England may operate an automobile on the authorization of his Canadian driver's licence for one year. After that he must pass the British driving test. This car-before-the-horse regulation is the source of amusement and chagrin to those who run up against it. But to the official behind the desk it is quite in order. It seems more than odd that a fellow can manoeuvre through London's maze for 12 months, weave around the country lanes at leisure for 52 weeks and then "we" to prove he can be trusted behind the wheel. But—and behind the mysteries of the British system there is always a but—here's the reason: To encourage tourists and be polite to visitors it is considered discreet to accept a foreign driving licence for a year. This is called a "Courtesy to Visitors" permit. But then the question arises: "How long is a visitor?" For if resident Englishmen have to pass a driving test they feel they've a right to how if foreigners can come into their preserve and shoot away at lib. And it has come to pass that a "visitor" is no longer a visitor if he has been here a year. Whereupon it is incumbent upon him to tie him to an inspector and answer such questions as: "Do you know the rule of the road?" and "What is the meaning of a traffic signal?" And when it comes to asking questions these inspectors don't leave anything unsaid.
