ANTS WITH UMBRELLAS.

The doings of ants are among the most interesting things that naturalists find to study. No members of the insect world present more startling suggestions of intelligence and forethought governing their actions. It is not correct, however, according to "Popular Science Sitings," to explain the habits and conduct of ants by human analogies. For instance, it was once supposed that the so-called "parasitic" ants, living in hot, tropical countries, carried little leaves above their heads for the sake of protection from the sun. But it has been found that while the ants actually do carry leaves, suspended by the stem which they hold in their jaws, and that columns of them thus furnished with leaves, like an army with banners, march in regular order, the leaves, instead of being intended to shelter the ants from the sunshine, are deposited round their nests to form a soil in which grows a kind of fungus they are fond of.


