Budget Passed In Commons By Vote Of 151-17

Government Charged With Continuing Political Patronage.

OTTAWA, July 5.—(CP)—By a vote of 151 to 17 the House of Commons tonight adopted the budget presented June 24 by Finance Minister Robison imposing new taxes expected to yield \$280,000,000 a year and providing expenditure of more than \$1,000,000,000 for the current fiscal year.

Nazis Declare Monroe Doctrine Is "Untenable"

WASHINGTON, July 5.—(CP)—A German note calling the United States' interpretation of the Monroe Doctrine "untenable" was disclosed today by State Secretary Cordell Hull, with his comment that nevertheless it still was "a basic policy of the Washington government" to prevent "aggression" in the western hemisphere.

News Briefs

Pro-German Government Takes Measures Against Jews and Press.

BUCHAREST, July 5.—(AP)—Rumania's new pro-German government suppressed permanent tonight. "In the interest of public order, two democratic Bucharest newspapers, Semanal and Jurnalul, it likewise was reported that decrees excluding Jews from journalism and the army were being prepared.

N. S. Fisherman Rescued At Sea

HALIFAX, July 5.—(CP)—Burnley Hamilton, 30-year-old Lockport, N. S. Fisherman, was brought into Halifax today aboard a freighter which found his dory tossed in high seas 45 miles off the Nova Scotia coast.

ROYAL NAVY SEARCHES SEAS FOR FRENCH

Bitter Dissolution of Allied Partnership Appears Underway.

LONDON, July 5.—(CP)—The Royal Navy today searched the seas for the last fugitive units of the French fleet and a bitter dissolution of the allied partnership appeared under way, because of what already has been done by Britain to the bulk of that fleet.

Blocks Petain's Plan

The action destroyed or put out of action a 22,000-ton battleship, a 26,000-ton battle cruiser, a 10,000-ton seaplane carrier and two destroyers. Along with seizure of other ships at Alexandria and in British ports, it made an end to the old French navy as an effective force and destroyed Petain's plan to turn it over to Hitler as France had promised to do.

BRITISH READY AT ALEXANDRIA TO STOP FRENCH

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, July 5.—(AP)—The British Navy pledged itself tonight to see that "no French ship shall ever leave Alexandria to surrender to the enemy."

University Students To Take Training

OTTAWA, July 5.—(CP)—Every male student in Canadian universities will take compulsory military training during the next college year as the universities cooperate with the government in applying the mobilization act to train men for home defence.

British Extend Coastal Defence Area In Preparation For Invasion

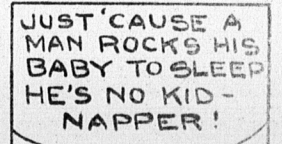
