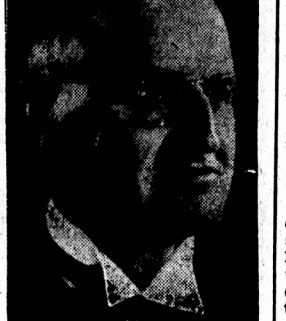

(Continued from Page 1) and inspiring influence on those who follow in your footsteps. May your efforts in civil life bring you great success and the advancement of your earnest desires."

Following is the text of the citations, which were read by Lt.-Col. F. S. Fielding, M.M.: Lieutenant-Colonel (Acting Colonel) Frederick Isaac Andrew, M.M., E.D., General List.

"This officer has served with devotion during the war 1914-1919 and in the non-permanent Active Militia between the two wars. He took over command of 62 Canadian Army (Basic) Training Centre on 18 August, 1940, and successfully organized and supervised the training centre until appointed to command No. 6 District Depot, at Halifax, Nova Scotia, on 1 January 1943. This officer took over command of the depot when the depot was not functioning efficiently. Through his untiring efforts, organizing ability and devotion to duty, he brought the depot up to a high standard, which has been increasing steadily. He has successfully prepared the depot for the great task of demobilization. Through this officer's great devotion to duty and his efforts well beyond normal requirements, District Depot No. 6 is well in advance of the present needs for demobilization.

Captain Douglas McGowan, Royal Canadian Armoured Corps. "Captain McGowan arrived in Normandy with 22 Canadian Armoured Regiment as technical adjutant. In this capacity he served through the campaign in France, Belgium and Holland. In January 1945, at his own request, he relinquished this appointment to serve with 2 Squadron as rear link captain. In this capacity he fought brilliantly with the tanks in the assault through the Hochwald forest where he was wounded in action. Near Louve En Auge, on 18 August 1945, the second day of the thrust to Falaise, the 22 Canadian Armoured Regiment was reduced to a tank strength of twenty three Sherman tanks and one Stuart. The confused fighting had by-passed many pockets of enemy resistance and unmarked minefields cut across the area making upon himself the search of the battlefield for recoverable tanks. Captain McGowan had frequently to leave his scout car to deal with enemy snipers. He returned with six prisoners then set out again to supervise the recovery of the tanks he had located.
