The Teachers Convention was very well patronised this week by the teaching fraternity from all over the Province.

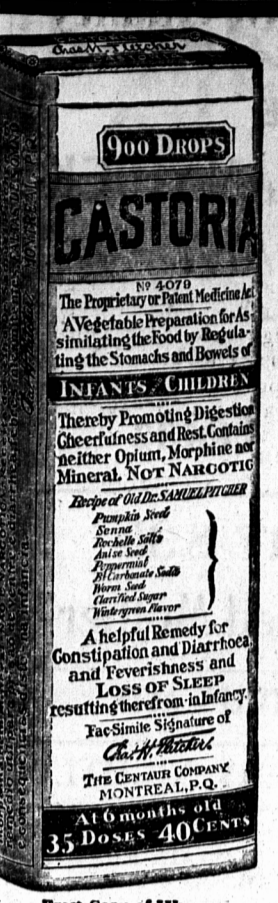

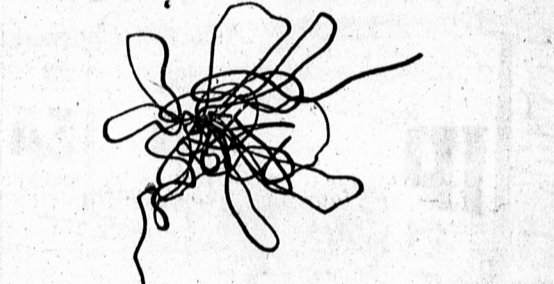
