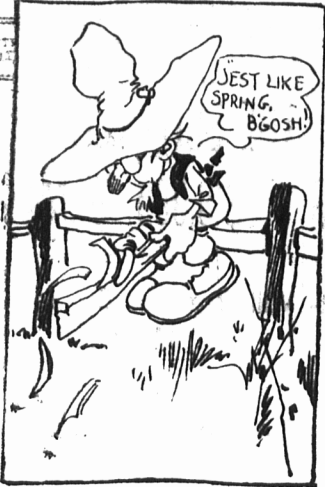

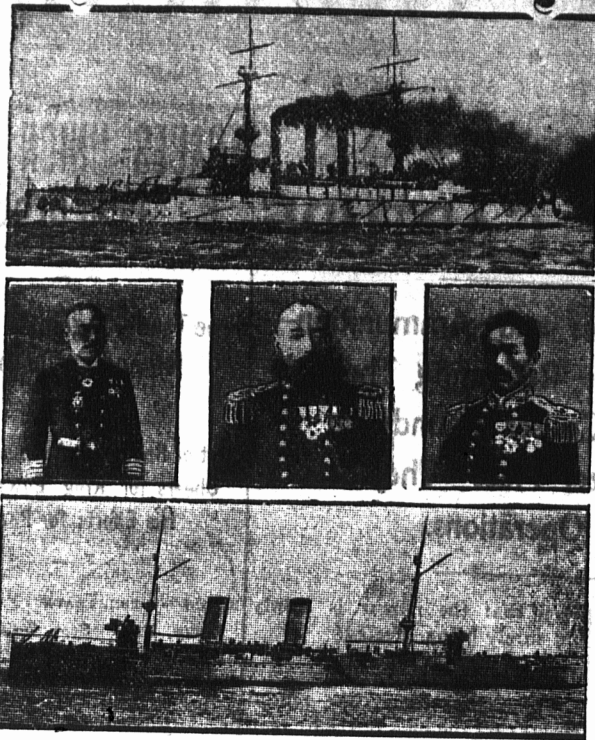

TO MAKE OWN PAPER.

St. John's, Nfld., Sept. 5.—Sir Alfred Harmsworth, of London, has arrived here to inspect large areas of woodland which his company recently purchased in the interior of the Island for the purpose of establishing the great pulp mill in the world. The areas embrace two thousand square miles excellently wooded. Sir Alfred's varied newspaper interests are in a corporation known as the Amalgamated Press, Ltd., of London. This has been capitalized it is said, for the purpose of operating the pulp mill, enterprising at 10,000,000. A plant valued at half that sum will be established and work started as soon as possible, the intention being to enlarge the plant as rapidly as circumstances will admit.
