ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., May 7—A plunge into twenty feet of water by Lillian Royer, twelve years old, saved the life of Howard Bolte, five years old, to-day. The boy had fallen from the bulkheads back of Ventnor and there was nobody but the girl near enough to save him. She was a hundred yards away when she heard the boy's screams. She ran to the water, leaped in and reached the boy's side with a few strokes. She brought him to the piling and held on with one hand while the other she retained her hold on Howard's collar. Two men, who had heard her call for help, found the pair. She insisted that the boy be taken in first and they complied with her request. While one man started reviving the boy the other pulled the girl out.

CAPITAL CELEBRATES DESPITE REVOLT.

MEXICO CITY, Mexico, via Galveston, Texas, May 6—The authorities took extra precautions today to prevent disorder on the occasion of the celebration commemorating the capture of Puebla in 1867 and the victory over the French. Soldiers were concentrated at centrally located barracks, and a strong force of police was on duty. Notwithstanding that a battle was probably going on at Toluca and P. T. rebels south of the city are usually troublesome, the celebration was held with as much apparent enthusiasm as if the country were tranquil. The boulevard was decorated with flowers and flags and the populace enjoyed the national holiday in usual manner. Features were bull fights, the grand drawing in the national lottery, music and parades. Throngs on the boulevards were entertained with a military pageant of two thousand five hundred regulars and two thousand volunteers and cadets, headed by President Madero and his Cabinet. ANOTHER STEAMER WAS SUNK IN THE ICE.

WASHINGTON, May 7—In its weekly bulletin of ice reported in the North Atlantic Ocean the hydrographic office of the Navy Department published an account of the sinking of a steamship under circumstances which, so far as known, were similar to those surrounding the loss of the Titanic. The identity of the lost vessel has not yet been established. The report was sent in by Captain Hole of the Norwegian steamer Ramsdal. He says that in latitude 45 degrees 50 minutes, longitude 54 degrees 10 minutes, he sighted an immense field of ice with a steamer 8,000 tons fast in it. At sunset he was still in sight of this steamer, and as it grew dark he saw rockets sent up from her which he took to be signals of distress. Captain Hole turned the Ramsdale to the assistance of the ship in distress and entered the ice field, but was compelled to stop, as the ice injured the vessel in several places. About midnight, Captain Hole reports, the signalling ceased and all lights on the distant vessel disappeared. When daylight came the steamer was no longer visible and Captain Hole is convinced that she sank in the night.

CALEDONIA, May 7—The death of Dr. T. R. Gates took place here at 1 o'clock this afternoon. About two weeks ago Dr. Gates contracted a cold which turned into pneumonia. It was soon realized that his condition was serious and Doctors Trites and Smith were called from Liverpool by Dr. McLeod, but human skill was unable to save him. He was the son of Rev. Laurence B. Gates, Baptist clergyman, and was born in Digby, forty-six years ago. He leaves a wife and two small children, a mother, two sisters and a brother L. B. Gates. The funeral will be at North Brookfield on Thursday. Mechanics lodge of Freemasons' of Caledonia, will conduct the services. Dr. Gates was nominated on the liberal ticket with Dr. J. W. Smith, of Liverpool, the present member at the last local election, but resigned before the election.

GRANTING FINANCIAL AID TO IRELAND.

LONDON, May 8—The Right Hon. Herbert L. Samuel, Postmaster General, in defending the position of granting financial aid to Ireland, said it was possible to establish an Irish Parliament under circumstances which would compel the increase of taxation in Ireland from 15 to 20 per cent. Under the Bill there was prospects that the annual grant would be reduced to a vanishing point, but the Unionist policy would increase the amount given by the United Kingdom to Ireland.
