Stock Markets At A Glance

TORONTO, July 11—(CP)—The Stock Market was inclined to go easy today following Monday's substantial advance and index losses were noted by the sold and base metal issues, western oils were practically unchanged.

LONDON, July 11—(CP)—Industrials scored fairly wide gains on the Stock Exchange today but oils tended lower and home rails advanced. Internationals were quiet and British funds received some support from investment sources.

WINNIPEG, July 11—(CP)—Wheat sales at the Winnipeg grain exchange today included 7,000,000 bushels of No. 1 and 2 northern to the United Kingdom and 200,000 bushels of No. 4 northern to the United States commodity credit corporation.

NEW YORK, July 11—(AP)—The Stock Market suffered, or enjoyed—depending on which side you were—a moderate technical correction today without losing its balance to any serious extent. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 1/4 of a point at 63.

MONTREAL, July 11—(CP)—Following recent buoyant sessions prices tapered off on average in transactions today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. All groups were down in the indices and brokers attributed most of the liquidation to profit-taking.

CHICAGO, July 11—(AP)—A high government crop forecast, including predictions of an all-time record wheat harvest, unsettled grain futures to-day. Declines were not as great as expected, however, and most prices rallied at times under short covering.

Rye and barley showed more strength than other grains. A rye crop was forecast less than had been predicted a month ago.
