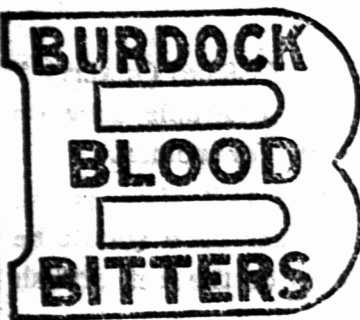

The Royal Line.

The new King, Edward VII, is descended from William the Conqueror, who claimed connection with the previous regime, and included Alfred the Great among his ancestors. Here is the family line traced backward from His Majesty to William; Edward VII; Son of Victoria; Daughter of Edward, Duke of Kent; Third son of George III; Son of Frederick Lewis Prince of Wales; Son of George II; Son of George I; Son of Princess Sophia, who married the Elector of Hanover; Daughter of James I; Son of Mary Queen of Scots; Daughter of James V., of Scotland; Son of Princess Margaret; Daughter of Henry VII; Son of Margaret, wife of Edmund Tudor Earl of Richmond; Daughter of John de Beaufort, Marquis of Somerset and Dorset; Son of John of Gaunt, Duke of Lancaster and King of Castile and Leon; Son of Edward III; Son of Edward II; Son of Edward I; Son of Henry III; Son of John of Magna Charta fame; Son of Henry II; Son of Matilda, wife of Geoffrey Plantagenet; Daughter of Henry I; Son of William the Conqueror. The King through the Georges is a Guelph. This family was founded in 489 by Anulphus Hunalphus or Guelph, the first of northern Kings of Italy. He subsequently obtained possession of Bavaria, and the Guelphs ruled there for many centuries and afterwards held sway in Saxony. One of the Guelphs, William, founder of the House of Lubeberg, had seven sons and eight daughters. The sons agreed among themselves not to divide the dukedom. One, to be selected by lot, was to marry, and he and his children after him were to rule. The unusual arrangement was observed to the letter, and George, the sixth brother, won the matrimonial prize. His youngest son, Ernest Augustus, succeeded him, marrying the Electress Sophia, daughter of the King of Bohemia, whose wife was the daughter of our James I. The Electress Sophia, granddaughter of James I., would have succeeded to the British Crown on the death of Queen Anne. But she died seven weeks before that monarch, and her son, George I., ascended the throne. By way of James I., and his daughter the Queen was connected with the Guelphs. She was also united in the same way to the Royal line of Scotland, James I., of Elizabeth, Duncan and Malcolm, of tragic fame. The Scotch line, the Norman line, and the Hanoverian or Guelph line, all unite in the Royal family. So does the old British monarchy. It is claimed that one branch of the family tree reaches to Alfred the Great and Egbert. The various races united in the King make him distinctly representative of the English to-day.

Sunday School Lesson.

FEBRUARY 17. THE LORD'S SUPPER. Memory verses, 20-28 GOLDEN TEXT. This do in remembrance of me.—Luke 22. 19. OUTLINE. 1. The Preparation, v. 17-19. 2. The Passover Feast, v. 20-25. 3. The Lord's Supper, v. 26-30. Time.—Thursday evening April 6. Place.—In and near Jerusalem. LESSON HELPS. 17. "First day of the feast of unleavened bread"—On Thursday, which was the day before the crucifixion. The feast was ordered by Moses, Exod. 12. 18. "The passover"—This was the greatest of the Jewish sacred feasts and marked the deliverance of the Jews from the bondage in Egypt. 19. "Made ready the passover"—Secured the room, purchased the lamb, the bread, and the wine. The lamb was slain in the courts of the temple by the priest and his blood sprinkled on the altar. 20. "Even was come"—The evening of the feast of the passover, and the twelve are the apostles. The feast opened with a prayer of thanksgiving. 21. "One of you shall betray me"—A remark purposely vague, to cause searching of heart. All had shown weakness, but could it be possible that one should fall so low? 22. 23. "Lord, is it I"—Each questioner felt his own weakness and asked in doubt yet in wonder. "And he answered"—As was more explicit, and showed the awful nature of the sin about to be committed. 24. "Woe unto that man"—History has confirmed that woe, for Judas is stamped as the greatest traitor the world has ever seen. That Christ foreknew his betrayal does not justify Judas in betrayal. Good for that man if he had never been born.—It seems as though restoration for that man was for ever impossible. 25. "Jesus took bread"—At the close of the feast he established a new rite. "This is my body"—Figurative language and so the apostle must have understood, for they saw Jesus and they ate without questioning. He showed in the act of breaking the bread that his body was soon to be broken upon the cross. Error has crept into some branches of the church by seeing or trying to see more in the words than the record implies. 28. "My blood of the new testament"—That is the new covenant made by God with men, and in contrast with the old covenant which was made with Moses: It is a reference to Exod. 24. 4-8 Jesus was the mediator of the new covenant as Moses was of the old. 30. "Had sung a hymn"—It is the only

case on record where the "Man of Sorrows" joined in sacred song. It was customary to close the passover feast with chanting a psalm. The Mount of Olives was opposite the city and separated from it by a deep valley.
