rather the colonel did, for our uniform skirts were too narrow, to permit of us doing likewise, so the matron and I set out on a "bone shaker," a heavy two wheeled cart without springs and a rough wooden box for a seat.
The Gap of Dunloe is a ravine four miles long through the highest mountain in Ireland, the Miglicuddy Reeks, and the scenery is alternately weird and picturesque. We crossed the famous Wishing Bridge, and you may be sure I shut my eyes and wished hard for there was no turning back.
The weather suddenly turned traitor now and the rain came down in sheets with heavy squalls. The usual trip is to ride through the Gap and take the boat trip down the lake to the hotel, but as the weather would not permit of our doing so, we drove back the way we had come, and had our lunch at "Kate Kearney's" Cottage, and were

driven back to our hotel in Killarney. Enjoyed the trip thoroughly, but was never so wet and cold in my life; we were all soaked to the skin.
Next morning we did some shopping in the town, and I am sure that Killarney would make a better impression on tourists if more attention were given to the care of its streets, crossings, etc. We left for Dublin at 11 o'clock and went right through to Belfast, arriving there at 8 p. m.
Tuesday we took the train for Port Rush, where we hired a car to take us to the Giants' Causeway—seven miles away. Port Rush must be a beautiful seaside resort in summer, and I should like to go back some day. I don't know how I can describe the Causeway. However, the enclosed P. C. will give you some idea of this unique natural formation. Centuries ago there were supposed to have been one or more volcanic eruptions and the lava, as it fell, was influenced by some ocean current, and the rocks became practically all uniform in size five and six sided rocks of stone, all separate and distinct piles together in all sorts

of groups and shapes. There is the cliff it is what is known as the "Giant's organ," pillars of this stone looking remarkably like a pipe organ.
Our guide told us we might never again have a better day on which to see these rocks. The tide was in and the storm on the sea seethed and boiled over the rocks and into the little bays between. From the seething waters large lakes of foam, like carded wool, were whirling on all sides right to the top of the cliffs, in some places 400 to 500 feet high—and what a sight!
Never shall I forget that October day at the Giant's Causeway. We did the Cliff walk, four miles each way, and were glad to welcome the sight of our car again that had been waiting for us. On the way back to the station we stopped to explore the ruins of Dunluce Castle, rough on the cliff over looking the sea.
Wednesday morning we spent sight-seeing in Belfast. This city is famous for its linen mills and great shipbuilding plants. Some of the largest steamers in the world were built in these shipyards. At noon we took the train for Carrick Fergus to visit an interesting old castle built in 1170 A. D., and then on to Larne, where we left by boat for Stranorlar, Scotland. Shortly after our arrival there we took the train for London, and not being able to secure a sleeper had to sit up all night. We reached the metropolis again the forgotten holiday in the Isle of the Weeks, in which we had a never-to-be-forgotten holiday in the Isle of the Shamrock.
