**YOUTH CENTRE** - At the regular meeting of the Summerside Youth Centre Incorporated held Friday evening, it was disclosed that the organization had been successful in purchasing a 16 millimeter moving picture projector. The matter was before the committee for some time and it is felt that by procuring the machine, a long required need has been fulfilled. It is a Victor sound machine of the latest type and will be used to bring educational and entertaining films of interest to the children of the school. In the modern curricula of education, much stress is being laid on the advantages of being able to put before the eyes of the student the facts which sometimes become glossed over by reading words from a text book. With a machine such as the one now owned by the S.Y.C.I. and which will be placed at the disposal of the school board, a great stride will have been made towards more effective methods of education. A film library has recently been organized in Charlottetown under the control of the Prince Edward Island Libraries Association and the S.Y.C.I. have the assurance of this library that they will gladly co-operate in the supplying of films to be shown to the children. In addition to this, there are other sources of travel and educational films to be secured from Government and Railway film libraries. Donations towards the cost of this projector have already been received and the S.Y.C.I. executive are making plans to sponsor a gymnastic show in the near future to assist in paying for the machine.—S.

### Liberals Name Candidates In First Prince

Mr. Fred O. Ramsay of Montrose, present Liberal member of the Provincial Legislature for the First District of Prince was unanimously nominated last night at a party convention at Alberton to contest the district as Councillor at the next general election. Mr. John Hector Richard, a lumber mill operator from Howland was selected to be his running mate. Three names were before the convention for Assemblyman. Mr. Richard's nomination was moved by Mr. B. J. Haywood and seconded by Mr. Irving Harding. Other names before the convention included that of Mr. Walter H. Bernard, merchant of Tignish, moved by Mr. Lloyd MacLeod and seconded by Mr. John B. Christopher and that of Mr. William E. Arsenault, fisherman of Cascumpeque, moved by Mr. Howard Clark and seconded by Mr. Maurice Perry. After the balloting gave the majority to Mr. Richard his nomination was made unanimous, on motion by Mr. Bernard and Mr. Arsenault. The president of the Liberal Association for the district, Mr. William MacKendrick of Cambellton, presided. Mr. Watson Hardy of Montrose was secretary. After the candidates were selected short addresses were made by Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. J. Watson MacNair, K.C., M.P., and Hon. George H. Barton. During the meeting resolutions of sympathy were tendered to the families of the late John Patrick Peters and Capt. J. R. Perry. All polls were represented, there being 90 delegates present.—S.

the organization, visited the Central Experimental Farm. While in Canada they will discuss with prospective Canadian shippers the requirements of buyers in Mexico, so as to be sure that only top quality animals are expected from Canada. The visitors brought with them an illuminated testimonial signed by Alfredo Pino Camara, President of the Union of Farmers of Mexico, for presentation to Dr. E. B.

H. Barton, Deputy Minister, Dominion Department of Agriculture. As Dr. Barton was away for a few days when the visitors were in Ottawa they intended to return to make the presentation before they left for Mexico. The testimonial conveys a friendly salute and the deepest respect from the farmers of the State of Mexico to the farmers of Canada.
