MONCTON, Dec. 2—The inauguration of new train service in Prince Edward Island was announced here today by Frank L. Dougan, general passenger agent, Canadian National Railways.

The additional trains will go into operation on Monday, December 8th. Two new trains will be operated between Charlottetown and Summerside, said Mr. Dougan.

Mr. Dougan said, No. 301 will leave Charlottetown at 10:30 A.M. and No. 302 will leave Summerside at 4:40 P.M. and arrive at Charlottetown at 6:40 P.M.

With the commencement of this new train service, Mr. Dougan stated, train No. 296, leaving Charlottetown at 12:01 P.M. and arriving at Summerside at 4:10 P.M., daily except Sunday, is cancelled.

The last trip of this train will be made on Saturday, December 6th, factoring project employing 1,000 workers.
