Reds Buy Oil Drilling Equipment

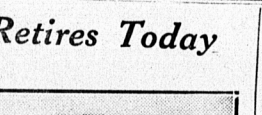

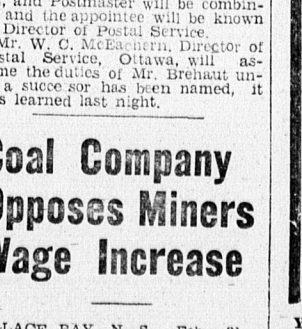
Coal Company Opposes Miners Wage Increase
