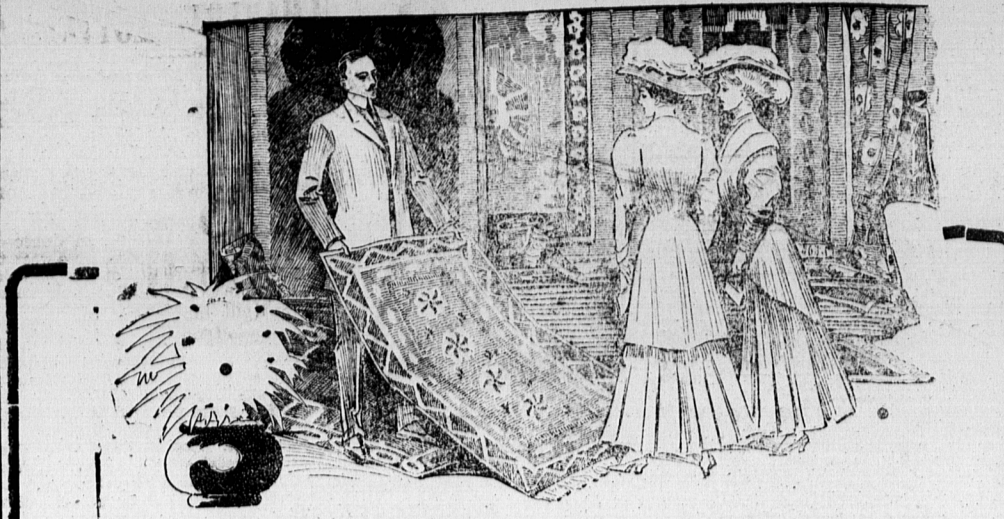
ITALY'S NEW LAWS

ROME, May 27.—Italy has celebrated the fiftieth year of its liberty and of its position as a nation. Great fetes have taken place at present in Rome, Turin, Florence and Naples.

The Italian civil code, although one of the most interesting, and significant celebration is to be found in the fact that Italy is advancing persistently and firmly in the way of true progress through the framing of improved laws.

In the year of 1905 the minister of Justice appointed a commission to revise the civil code, formed of many of the most prominent Italian men. The work was arduous, but nevertheless well accomplished.

This year the proposals of the commission are to be presented to the House of Deputies and to the Senate. If we add to these proposals the other laws discussed and approved, we can see that by the beginning of next year Italy will have made a very important step forward.
