IRRIGATED LANDS YIELD BIG CROPS

BROOKS, Alta., Nov. 5 — (CP)
 —Near this town just at the dividing line between this year's drought area and the districts where it rained during the summer, there lies one of Alberta's most prosperous farming districts. An irrigation system furnishes its life blood. The area, known as the Eastern Irrigation District, yielded nearly 2,000,000 bushels of wheat this year. Bumper yields have become common. So far the record is held by a farmer at Tilley with an average wheat crop of 63 bushels an acre. A 20-acre plot of barley averaged 75 bushels an acre while a field of fluffy alfalfa seed returned 34 1-2 bushels an acre. Many of the land-owners are farmers of long standing who came to the district during the last few years after they gave up hope for their former holdings in the dried-out district further east. Most of them have used a large part of their profits to pay off indebtedness. "Santa Claus will come to our house for the first time in a good few years," one of the newcomers remarked.
