Possibility of M.A.A.A. Squad Appearing On Official Opening of New Brunswick Forum.

That the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association, holders of the Allan cup emblematic of the amateur hockey supremacy of the world may appear here in connection with the formal opening of the new rink early next month, is a possibility according to information gleaned from a reliable source last night.

Other powerful hockey clubs of Upper Canada and the west who have stated their willingness to co-operate in every way with Moncton in the official opening of the new ice palace are the Sault Greyhounds, the Winnipeg Falcons, and the Montreal C. N. R. The first two mentioned teams were formidable contenders for the Allan Cup last spring and would prove popular in the opening attraction here.

However to bring a team of the calibre of those mentioned above, the greatest of which is the M. A. A. A. will need the co-operation of Victoria Hockey Club the Moncton Exhibition Co., and those who have made possible the building of the new rink, undoubtedly one of the finest in Eastern Canada. In the event of one of these clubs appearing here which should be a drawing card, attracting fans from all over this section of the country, it would take the place of the Wolverines. It is understood, who were previously announced as opposition for the revamped and bolstered Victorias.

Moncton Attracting Attention

Hockey moguls in both classes of hockey, amateur and professional in Upper Canada and the West, are particularly pleased and interested in Moncton's new forum. Word from several points as far west as Vancouver indicate these interested in sport, in general and hockey in particular, are much pleased that the cities in the Maritimes are building new rinks and equipping them with artificial ice plants.
