The discovery of tuberculosis in the herd on the Falconwood farm, one of the best bred and most valuable herds in the province, is a matter which should set our farmers and our people generally seriously thinking...

The affected cattle on the Falconwood farm showed no previous symptoms of the disease; nothing in their appearance would lead the casual observer to suspect disease; they were to all outward appearance such cattle as furnish daily meat and milk to the people everywhere.

What is to be done? No doubt our federal and provincial governments will move in the matter, but large bodies move slowly and in the meantime the disease, which is highly infectious, is spreading.

But what of the indiscriminate use of uninspected meat? The City of Charlottetown has taken a commendable step in providing for milk inspection. This step, however, is but a partial one.

REOPENING OF THE SCHOOLS.

Next Tuesday, September third, the schools throughout the province will re-open after the midsummer holidays. Teachers and pupils will, after the long rest, we trust, resume their duties with the joy that the true worker ever finds in his work.

There are many reasons why this year should see a good beginning and why the term just opening should be of special interest to teachers and pupils. In the first place the expenditure for school purposes this year will be nearly \$20,000 more than that of last year.

unless the work of the school will be paid indiscriminately to teachers re-warrant it; that is, it is not to be regarded of the quality of their work.

This year also there are many young teachers engaged. They have their "spurs to win." Their reputation as teachers will depend upon the beginning they make.

To secure the best results from our schools teachers, trustees and parents must work faithfully and sympathetically together and this work to be effective must begin with the re-opening of the schools.

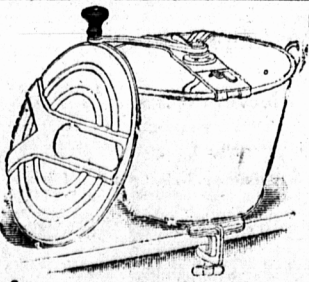

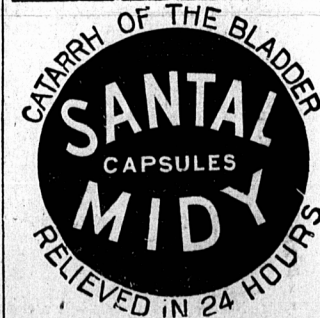
