An offering will be taken up at the afternoon and evening sessions. A rally of Sunday-school workers, which will be addressed by Rev. Mr. Ganong, will be held in Fredericton hall on July 14th, at 7.30 p. m.

The Sydney Record says that Rev. J. L. Among the resolutions that will come up for consideration at the Farmers Institute Convention in Summerside on Tuesday are: (a) Resolved that it would be in the interests of Agriculture in the Maritime Provinces to have the Maritime Seed Fair held in Summerside in the month of March, instead of as at present, at Amherst in Dec. (b) Resolved that it would be in the interests of Agriculture in P. E. Island to have all the weeds named in the Provincial Weed Act that are mentioned in the Seed Control Act, particularly those that are as yet not common in this Province, in addition to those already named. (c) Resolved that we the farmers of Prince County in Convention assembled approve of the action of the Dept. of Agriculture in establishing and encouraging Farmers' Institutes, and would respectfully ask that prompt action be taken to organize in the parts of the Province that are as yet unorganized, and further that the whole time of Prof. Ross, who has proved himself capable of organizing and of infusing new life and energy into those already organized, be given to the work of the Institutes. In the evening an Agricultural meeting will be held which will be addressed by prominent Agriculturists.
