There is a saying that over every revolution that takes place may be inscribed the words "too late." Delay in granting needed reform leads to an uprising of the misruled people. Then, when the current of popular unrest and revolt has been raised to the danger point, concessions are made and reforms promised or granted through fear, and are little regarded. The people will seize their liberties as of right when once it is within their power to do so, rather than accept them as a gift from their oppressors.

It is thus in China. The Chinese people in a great central valley of that vast country, have risen in revolt against the Manchu dynasty, under which they have suffered for hundreds of years. Some years ago a Parliament was promised them, but its institution was delayed. The Chinese people had very little to say or do with their own government in the past. Their more recent demands were that the Parliament should be hastened, that a cabinet in sympathy with the Chinese people be created, and that certain members of the Manchu nobility now surrounding the throne should be dismissed or removed.

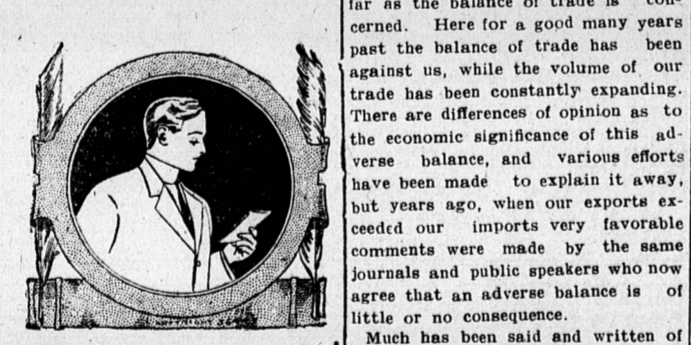
Little heed was paid to these demands until the revolution was well on foot and the great Yang Tee Kiang valley, with its vast cities and tens of millions of people, was aflame with revolt. Now concessions are being offered—in the name of the Emperor who is five years old! Of course, this is the act of his advisers, the real rulers of China, and results from their fears. The Emperor is made to say that although he has reigned three years and has always acted conscientiously, "I have not employed men properly as I am without political skill. I have employed too many nobles in political positions, which contravenes the constitution."

This is going far when it is considered that it is the Manchu nobles who, in condemnation of themselves, now put these words in the Emperor's mouth. The imperial edict, which reads like a confession, goes:
