SORRY FOR SIR LOUIS DAVIES

Collector Bidwell said yesterday that he had received no instructions from Washington to investigate the complaint of Sir Louis Davies of the Dominion Cabinet that he received scant courtesy at the hands of the New York Custom House when last Saturday he landed from the steamship Campania. "Sir Louis," said Mr. Bidwell, "was no doubt traveling on business for the British Government. We received instructions from the Treasury Department to extend to him the usual courtesies of the port." "This simply meant that the customs officers were to expedite the landing and examination of his baggage. It by no means meant that he was entitled to free entry. His baggage was in such circumstances liable to examination, and was examined. Free entry is the privilege of High Commissioners, Ambassadors, and Ministers and Secretaries of Legation."

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The report coming from Canada to the effect that Sir Louis Davies, a member of the Canadian Cabinet, recently returned from England, was not well treated by the customs officials at New York, was mentioned in the Cabinet to-day. The President sincerely regrets that Sir Louis was put to any inconvenience, and it is probable that the regrets of this Government will be forwarded to him.—New York Times.
