A War To Be Won

It is always well to be reminded that before we start building post-war utopias, there is a war to be won.

The quickest way to win the war is not for the politicians to devote themselves to post-war promises, but to make certain that Canada is doing everything possible to win.

In fact, the situation in the Air Force, in its demand for air-crew, has reached the stage where Air Force advertisements are framed on the "shame" principle.

Very little concern is shown by our politicians over the faults in certain production plants. Criticism of inefficiencies, if they directly apply to the production of munitions of war, has been secondary.

Big Transformation

Johann Kepler, astronomer, born near Weil, Wurtemberg, this date 1571; settled in Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1599, succeeding Tycho Brahe as Imperial astronomer; published his great work, "The New Astronomy: Commentaries on the Motions of Mars," in 1609; the discoveries which this volume records form the basis of physical astronomy; in it, he enunciated his first two laws relating to motion, and the third he described in "The Harmonies of the World," published in 1619, and dedicated to King James I.

Stuck by the juice of apples like thin honey

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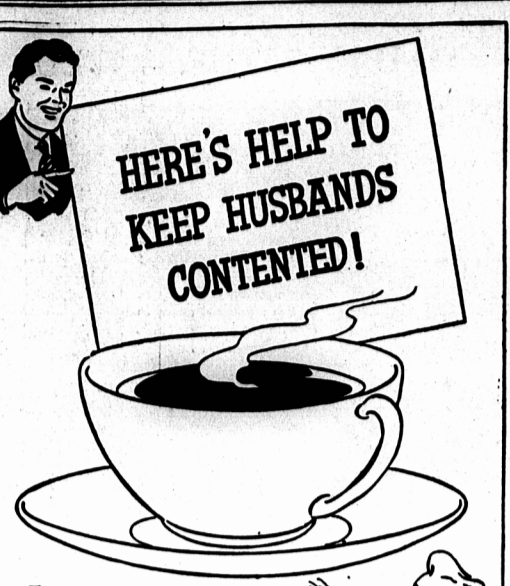
