To Inquire Into Trading In Gold Mine Shares

TORONTO, Sept. 12.—(CP)—Col. T. P. O'Connor, senior solicitor for the Ontario Securities Commission, said today the commission will proceed "probably Monday" with an investigation of transactions in shares of Eldona gold mines. Authority to investigate was obtained from the Ontario attorney-general's department. The inquiry will seek to establish whether there was illegal trading in Eldona shares. Eldona trading has been marked during the last three weeks by wide fluctuations on the stock exchange. The investigation is expected to show whether pools have been operating to manipulate the stock. Arthur P. Earle, Eldona president, said yesterday in a paid advertisement addressed to small shareholders of mining company stock that Eldona still was "a highly speculative security".

Wheat & Oat Crops Show Decline

OTTAWA, Sept. 12.—(CP)—Canada's 1947 wheat crop was placed today by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at 352,200,000 bushels from an estimated seeded acreage of 23,900,000 acres yielding an estimated 14.7 bushels per acre. This was a drop of approximately 6,900,000 bushels from the first estimate of 358,786,000 bushels made Aug. 13. The new 352,200,000-bushel total includes 333,979,000 bushels of spring wheat and 18,296,000 bushels of fall wheat. The new estimate also compares with a 1946 wheat production of 420,725,000 bushels. Oats production now is placed at 282,249,000 bushels against a 1946 crop of 400,969,000, barley production at 131,225,000 against 159,887,000 a year ago and rye at 14,818,000 against 7,448,000. The rye total includes 10,818,000 bushels of fall rye and 3,345,000 of spring rye. All-Canada production of hay and clover now is placed at 15,300,000 tons, with alfalfa at 2,400,000 tons.

ROUND THE WORLD WITH ALCOHOL

In 1946 the British Government reduced the alcohol for cereals for brewing by 18 per cent and allowed no grain for distilling. The new Highway Code, distributed last July to 15,000,000 (fifteen million) household in Great Britain, a booklet of 22 pages of road counsel, has this to say: "Be sure that you are fit to use the road. ALCOHOL, even in small amounts, lowers your alertness and sense of caution. A fraction of a second may make all the difference between safety and disaster. If you cannot give the necessary concentration, you are risking not only your own life but the lives of others. Many drugs have this effect and so also has fatigue." The Parliament temperance education in schools receives constant attention; in 1945 there were 3,000 pupils entered the annual examination of the Temperance Education Board. THE P.E. is concerned with the limitation of public houses. Efforts are made to provide counter attractions by inducing authorities to provide facilities for non-alcoholic refreshments in pleasant surroundings. In Norway the Parliament provides funds for the treatment of inebriates and for educative temperance activity. Sweden's Government provides over half a million dollars in the 1947-1948 Budget for treatment of alcoholics and support of the homes of inebriates; also \$63,750 for the work of official temperance committees.

Manuel Martinez, 34, of Toledo, O., has been convicted by an army general court of the robbery and murder of a Paris cafe proprietor and sentenced to be hanged. The victim, Henri Gelot, was slain in his cafe last May 22.

Troop Census Is Proposed By Britain

By MAX HARRELSON LAKE SUCCESS, N.Y., Sept. 12.—(AP)—An immediate worldwide troop census was proposed by Britain today in a surprising assembly move by the year-old Molotov arms reduction scheme. The British proposal was outlined before a committee of the United Nations Committee for conventional armaments by Sir Alexander Cadogan as delegates were gathering for the opening of the 55-nation General Assembly at Flushing Meadow Park in New York Tuesday. This was the first time the controversial troop census question had come up since the 1946 Assembly in which debate became so bitter that the issue had to be stepped in order to get agreement on even a nebulous start for an ACMS reduction program. The program was originally put before the Assembly last fall in a surprise move by Foreign Minister V.M. Molotov. Cadogan proposed officially that the Arms Commission send out a circular letter asking all the United Nations to submit information on their present total manpower under arms. He also suggested asking each country what facilities it would offer the U.N. for verification.
