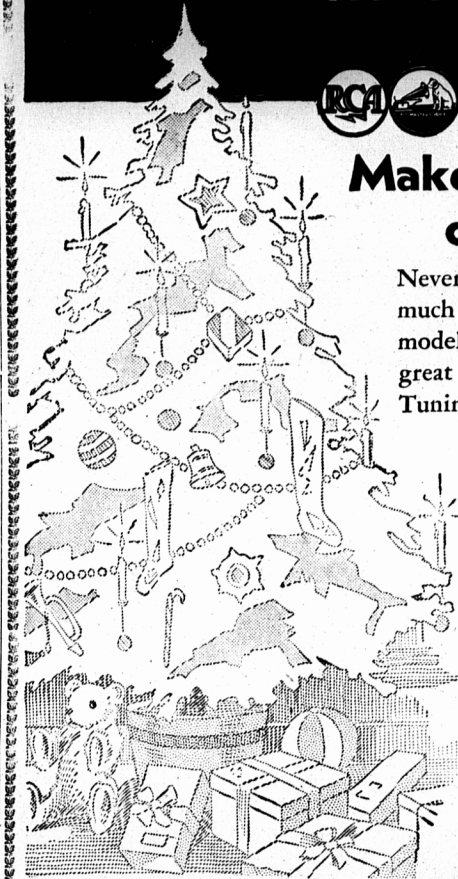

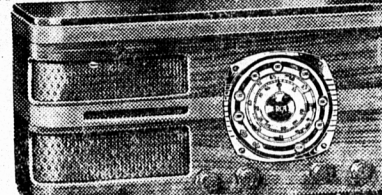
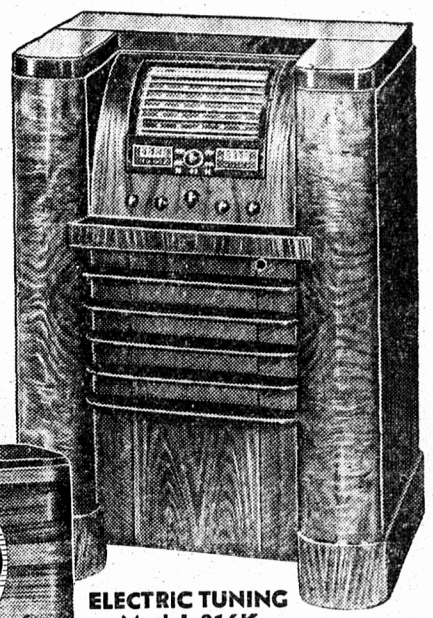

Your Honour has had a long and extensive practice at the Bar of this Province, and you have also capably filled the position for many years as Magistrate for Queens County, and you are therefore eminently fitted for the high position to which you have been called; and we feel sure that you will deal with all cases that come before you impartially and effectively. We are delighted to know that you are to become a citizen of the Town of Summerside, and knowing something of your pleasant social qualities and happy entertaining abilities, your coming will be all the more welcome. Judge Shaw made a fitting reply expressing gratification for the kindly address and intimating that this would be an encouragement for him in the days to come to fulfill the duties of his office to the best of his ability. He referred to the gentlemen who preceded him on the bench in Prince County in a fitting manner, stating that his aim and ambition would be to emulate their high example and his motto would be as suggested by an eminent member of the Bar of another province in a congratulatory message that his association with the members of the Bar would be most pleasant, his judgment fair and honest and his mistakes as few as possible. Mr. C. D. McCallum paid a tribute to the late Judge Inman. He stated that Judge Inman fittingly sat on the County Court Bench for 9 1/2 years and during that time the members of the Bar all appreciated his fairness and his great desire to always render fair judgments. It was difficult to estimate the loss the Bar had sustained by his demise, and the Bar of Prince County now desired to place on the minutes of the Court a tribute to his memory and an expression of deep regret in his passing and that the same be communicated to the bereaved widow and family. The Court then adjourned over the holiday to the 18th of January. There is quite a large docket to be disposed of.
