that showed they were within themselves in every period, Abegweits defeated Bathurst Papermakers here last night by a score of 7 to 2.

The game as a whole was just a steady Abegweit advance into the visitors territory, and after getting into scoring position it was just a case of a good shot or a gummed up play.

The local front lines and defence were so outstanding that Bathurst hockeyists failed to impress offensively and defensively, were wide open on almost every advance. It was laxity on the part of Abegweits in picking up passes just outside the blue line that held the score down to seven.

CRIMINALS MORE ASTUTE THAN A GENERATION AGO

LEEDS, England, Jan. 11.—Crime in England is greater than at any time during the last 60 years, Mr. Justice McCauley declared in opening the assizes.

"We must be under no illusions," the justice said: "The statistics are grave. Indictable offenses are increasing in the country at the rate of thousands a year. When I reflect upon the cause of crime I come to the conclusion that drink has very little to do with the serious crime of today; no, the primary cause is fundamental. They spring from defects of human nature—from greed, lust, vanity and anger."

Modern criminals, he believes are "more ingenious and more astute than the criminals of a generation ago."

Latest Statistics Of National Hockey League

MONTREAL, Que., Jan. 11.—Only five scoring points separate eight players in the struggle for scoring and points-making honors in the National Hockey League, according to figures released tonight by Pres. Frank Calder.

"Hooley" Smith of the Maroons has again forged into the lead, but by a scant margin. His 23 points give him a margin of a single point over W. Cook, right wing of the Rangers, leader of the American division, while three players are behind Cook with 21 points each. Another trio closely trail with 20 points.

Of Smith's 23 points, 16 are for assists, while Cook has secured his 22 by 17 goals and 5 assists. Two members of the Toronto Leafs "kid line" and a Boston player are entangled in the 21 point tie for third position. Charlie Conacher, another unit in the Toronto line, leads all the actual goalgetters with 18, but has had only two assists, giving him a tie with Nels Stewart of Maroons.
