THE MILITIA CAMP.

We have been surprised to hear that objection has been taken to the occupation of Victoria Park for the annual drill of the militia. If our memory serves rightly, in the conveyance of the lands of the Park to the city the right to use a large portion of its area, including the cricket field, for military purposes was reserved. Be that as it may and apart from legal rights we think it the duty of the city and believe it to be the disposition of the great majority of our citizens to treat the citizen soldiery with cheerful hospitality and extend to them every opportunity to better qualify themselves for the defence of the country.

So far as our information goes Camp Brighton has been orderly and well conducted in past years, and there is the best of reasons to believe that it will be equally so in the future. There is usually a much larger attendance at the Park during the time of the camp than at other times which would go to show that the camp is an attraction rather than the nuisance that some objectors would declare it to be. The annual meeting of the militia for drill is also a source of profit to our city by the disbursement of some seven or eight thousand dollars in our midst. We are informed and believe that on one occasion last year when some disturbance was raised one night on the Brighton Road while the camp was occupied the trouble was wholly occasioned by some disorderly persons from the city in which no militia man had any part.

SOME TARIFF CHANGES.

A telegram from Horace Hazard M. P. gives the information that among the few tariff changes will be the admission hereafter of molasses from the British Islands free and a reduction of the duty on kerosene oil to two and a half cents. A special duty will also be levied on American goods dumped on the Canadian market, a practice which has become altogether too prevalent of late. The reduced duty on kerosene will be none the less welcome from being too long delayed. The rate of five cents per imperial gallon has now been cut in half and no doubt consumers will get the benefit when present stock is disposed of. Molasses also should be something cheaper hereafter as the result of being placed on the free list when imported from the British Isles. There are some other minor changes. The Government can well afford to make these favorable changes in the interest of consumers when the revenue of the Dominion is so buoyant.

It is announced that the Sydney steel works will be shut down until the market for its products improve. As the market has been steadily declining with no prospect of an early improvement this means an indefinite suspension of operations in this large and very costly plant. It also means the end of the strike, and the necessity for the strikers to look for employment elsewhere. All of which is deeply to be regretted as it involves a serious blow to the business interests of Sydney, and also to many P. E. Island producers the loss of an excellent market.

A surplus in the Dominion treasury is a good thing in many ways. It enables the Government to provide liberally for the needful public services without borrowing. It enhances the national credit, and it helps to spread the fame of Canada. It is also an index of prosperity, especially where taxation is not burdensome. The great bulk of the Dominion revenue is raised by duties on imported goods and by excise duties on liquors and tobacco. This is taxation in indirect form. When the country is prosperous, as Canada is and has been for years past, the people are able to buy and pay for more dutiable and excisable merchandise than they otherwise would and the burden of taxation is not greatly felt. There is, however, one great danger from a succession of surpluses such as Canada has enjoyed—the danger of establishing a lavish rate of expenditure which it will be very difficult to curtail and impossible to maintain without borrowing when the time of commercial depression returns, as return it must. This is Canada's danger today.
