

IMPORTANT READING MATTER SELECTED FROM THIS WEEK'S NEWS FOR THE GUARDIAN'S SATURDAY SUBSCRIBERS

MONDAY. —The marriage took place recently at the home of John Clements, East Walpole, Mass., of his sister Annie to Robert A. Jack, formerly of Herbron, Lot 8, P. E. I., the bridegroom coming from Idaho to Boston to claim his bride.

(From Tacoma Exchange.) One of the most mysterious accidents ever recorded in Alberta occurred at the C. P. R., depot here on Thursday evening at 7.45, when the station building was wrecked by a terrific explosion, and baggage man Everett G. McLeod, injured to such an extent that he died early Friday morning.

After the train from the south had left the station on Thursday evening, baggage man McLeod and his assistant, G. Bickford, were putting away the baggage that had arrived. In making room in the shed, McLeod had to move a small trunk from one part of the room to another. Taking it up he set it down on the floor, when immediately the explosion occurred. McLeod was knocked down terribly injured, his legs being shattered and

the rest of his body severely burned. Bickford was also knocked down and burned, but escaped very serious injury. The station house was wrecked. The baggage room was completely blown out of existence, the roof and sides being thrown in all directions. The force of the explosion was so great that the wall of the ladies' waiting room was blown in with great force, the benches being thrown across the room and broken against the opposite wall. In the agent's office, next to the ladies' waiting room, the force of the explosion was also very evident. The operator and one of the staff were thrown forcibly to the floor, chairs and tables were overturned, and the office fixtures torn from their places. In the freight office, south of the baggage room, the damage was also great. The wall was moved in over a foot, the stove and desks were overturned, the chimney knocked down, and other damage done. Across the street windows in the Day Block and Morrison & Johnston's store, Urquhart's store and the Vickers Block were shattered by the concussion, while buildings in all parts of town were perceptibly shaken. To add to the perceptible shaking, the wrecked building caught fire, but the splendid work done by the fire brigade soon controlled the flames, and this source of danger was overcome. As soon as the explosion occurred hundreds of citizens were on the spot, and the injured baggage man was taken from the ruins and rushed to the hospital. An examination showed that his left leg was shattered to such an extent that immediate amputation was necessary, and the operation was at once performed. In addition to injuries to his legs, McLeod was terribly burned, his whole body being a mass of charred flesh. After the operation the deceased rallied well, and hopes were entertained that the doctors would be able to pull him through. The work of the doctors and nurses was without avail, however, and about five o'clock Friday morning death relieved the injured man of his awful sufferings. Bickford, who is suffering from burns and shock, is rapidly regaining strength under the careful care of his doctor and the nurses of the hospital. He is severely burned about the face and neck.

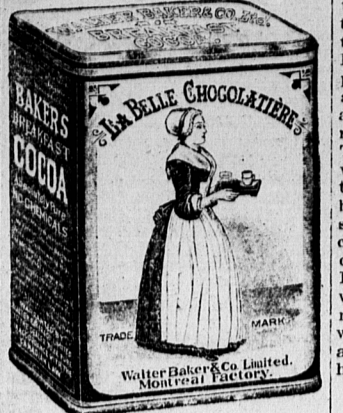

that prior to leaving the studio in the southern city they had seen their employer mix a quantity of the flashlight powders, one of the ingredients of which was magnesium powder. They did not know the exact amount that was prepared, but thought it would be slightly in excess of one pound. The powder was packed with a quantity of plates, cameras and chemicals used in the development of pictures, and the entire lot was placed in a small trunk and checked to Lacombe.

If it can be proved that Nein and Leine were carrying explosives in their trunk they are liable to heavy penalties. Section 21 of the Canadian Railway Act, 1903, says: "No passenger shall carry gunpowder, dynamite, nitro-glycerine, or any goods which are of a dangerous or explosive nature. And any person who sends by the railway any such goods without distinctly marking their nature on the outside of the package containing the same, and otherwise giving notice to the station agent or employee of the company whose duty it is to receive such goods for the purpose of carriage, shall forfeit to the company the sum of \$500 for every offence."

Part 8, section 509, of the criminal code, 1910, says: "Every one who causes any event by an act which he knew would probably cause it, being reckless whether such event happens or not, is deemed for the purpose of this act to have caused it willfully."

LACOMBE, Alta., Oct. 27.—That Everett G. McLeod came to his death from injuries received from the explosion of a trunk in the baggage room of the C. P. R., depot at Lacombe on the evening of October 12, 1911, and from evidence produced it is the opinion of the jury that the trunk causing the death of the said Everett G. McLeod, was checked over the C. P. R., from Red Deer to Lacombe by Henry Leonard Nein and Harry Leine.

The above is the verdict of the coroner's jury on the death of the C. P. R., baggage man, who was killed in the explosion, which wrecked the depot here on the 12th, inst. Bickford, the assistant baggage man, who was also severely injured at the time, was able to leave the hospital and appear before the jury. He is still very weak and suffers from the severe burns received. His evidence was with reference to the trunk which exploded and which was taken off the train by him on the evening of the accident.

Several other witnesses were called with reference to the trunk, the most damaging evidence to the parties under arrest being given by the baggage master at Red Deer, who identified positively Leine and Nein as being the parties who checked the trunk from Red Deer to Lacombe. From evidence brought out the trunk contained a large amount of potassium chlorate and magnesium metal powder. Leine and Nein were taken to Fort Saskatchewan being held by the R. N. W. M. P., to await a preliminary trial on a charge of manslaughter.
