## POTATOS SCARCE IN ANNAPOLIS

CORNWALLIS, Nov. 2.—The schooner Rescue finished loading a cargo of forty-one hundred barrels of potatoes at Canning, on Monday last. She will sail for Havana shortly with Capt. Alfred Potter in command. There was a light crop of potatoes in most sections of the country this year. Some attribute this to the fact that almost all varieties of potatoes in the Annapolis and Cornwallis Valleys have run out. The farmers are introducing new varieties of potatoes at present. Mr. George Holt, of Hallaton, who sometimes plants as many as sixty acres of potatoes, has planted two new kinds of potatoes this year. One variety was imported from Scotland and is of a superior quality. The other kind is called the Puritan. Both varieties are said to be great yielders and many prove to be of great benefit to the potato industry.
