Checks and Drafts.
A bank check is really a slight draft on the depositor's bank. It differs from a draft in wording and is used in paying a creditor, whereas a draft is commonly used as a means of collecting money from a debtor. The bank is obliged to pay a check if it has funds enough of the drawer to meet it, but the person on whom a draft is drawn may or may not honor it at pleasure. Another use to which merchants put drafts is in sending remittances from one part of the country to another, for as banks keep money on deposit in all of the large commercial centers a bank draft is simply the bank's check drawing on its deposit with some other bank which it calls its correspondent. Banks sell these drafts or "cashier checks" to customers.
